*1st of Jack's 2 favorite subversive stories: Danish community (not sure if I recorded community correctly, Vel) get together various deputies, send to G-d and demand G-d do something to help the situation with tyrannical ruler...We desperately need something...G-d says to angel, "Go look in my library and see if there's any law that says I created king, dictators, princes." There is not..."I'm sorry G-d can't help you." People continue to plead. G-d says to the angel: "Ok we'll take pity. Go into my deep archive and see if you find anything." Again the angel finds nothing, but the deputies cry, "Please, please one more chance..." Once more nothing is found. Finally G-d goes out to deputies: "You have created these kings, and you will have to deal with this situation yourself..."
