1 – DEFINING DISCIPLESHIP

What should discipleship look like? Discipleship in our society today is similar to the word, 'apprenticeship'. What is an apprentice? Share some practical examples of apprenticeships in our world today. What can we learn from these examples? How does this apply to our participation in discipleship? What should discipleship *not* look like?

In Acts 2:41-42 three thousand people get saved and they devote themselves to four things. **How has fellowship cultivated discipleship in your life?**

2 - FELLOWSHIP & 'KOINONIA' [Greek; κοινωνία]

How could we "break past the veneer" & cultivate *deep* relationships in this group that result in real discipleship to Jesus happening?

How does fellowship have a much richer meaning than just community? What does it mean to be devoted to fellowship?

Why does 'church hopping' kill our best chances of growing in deep fellowship with one another? Why do people 'church hop'?

Do you have an "inner circle" like Jesus did with Peter, James & John? How can you, and how long does it take to cultivate these?

3 - OVERCOMING OBSTACLES

How is fellowship broken? Discuss specifically the effects and dangers of offence, and the danger of becoming offended. **How does the enemy use offence to separate believers from one another?** Andy referenced Proverbs 18:19 & Proverbs 19:11.

What are the specific negative effects of each of these barriers? (i) Consumerism & Individualism; (ii) Comfort-Driven Mindset; (iii) Lack of Margin & Busyness; (iv) Isolation & Technology

Read 1 John 1 and reflect on how having a grace filled fellowship with God now allows us to have grace filled fellowship with each other.
