Staff expectations:

- We will refrain from any action that may cause a brother or sister to stumble.
- We will refrain from any action that may hurt our witness to the world.

Statement of Faith

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;



he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of Life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.
He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic (1) and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

1. catholic means "general, universal, concerning the whole" Short Explanation of Nicene Creed

The Nicene Creed (381 A.D.) was formed by church elders to clearly define a statement of beliefs reaffirming orthodox Christianity in belief in God the Father, Son, and Spirit. The beliefs outlined are:

- 1. Jesus is God, eternal and not created
- 2. Jesus died on the cross and rose from the dead
- 3. The Holy Spirit is Lord as well
- 4. There is one universal church
- 5. The dead will be resurrected on the final day

Why this Statement of Faith

Belief in the Triune God, God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit, is an essential part of the biblical faith. Knowing God, and living a life constantly affirming this, is part of what it means to be a Christian.
