Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent, a time of spiritual warfare, of fasting, penitence, and preparation for the Easter feast. Beginning in the tenth century ashes were imposed on this day upon penitent sinners in preparation for their restoration to full communion with the Church. Since the eleventh century, ashes have been imposed upon all the faithful as a reminder that the wages of sin is death. As God said to Adam, "dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return." (Genesis 3:19b) But as we are marked with ashes in the same manner that we were signed with the cross in our Baptisms, we are also reminded that we only have life in Christ, the second Adam.

The Rector's Corner - "You might want to read it"

The Word of God demonstrated

Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me - put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.' (Philippians 4:9.)

In every generation, and in every part of the world, the Word of God must become flesh before people can see the truth and reality of God. In this Word-resistant age, it is not enough to throw biblical statements to the outsider. For most folk, God-words are empty words. But when the word can be demonstrated in our lives, relationships and love, the presence of the living Christ will be clearly manifested and perceived.

Calling for radical discipleship, some of the church leaders from Latin America and the Lausanne Congress affirmed that there is no biblical dichotomy between the word spoken and the word made visible in the lives of God's people. People will look as they listen, and what they see must be one with what they hear. Otherwise, they will end up putting a big question mark on Christianity and its members.

Although evangelism and social action are distinct, both are vitally and equally important in the total mission of the church. It is inadequate to call only for repentance from personal sins, and redemption for individuals; and it does not make sense to talk only about 'evangelizing' social structures. The Great Commission calls Christians to preach the gospel and to teach new converts to observe all instructions given by Christ, many of which have strong social implications. Likewise, the Great Commission tells us to love our neighbor, and we cannot do this in the fullest sense unless we care about both our neighbor's spiritual and social needs. Christ called us to a holistic religion – both theory and practice. Theory and practice are the two axes on which every religion turns. Both are indispensable to the Christian believer.

Prayer: Lord, may people not only hear what I believe, but see it in my life too. Amen!

Question: When unbelievers look at Christians, what do they see?
