Dr. Rosielle has been a faculty member for the Center to Advance Palliative Care's Palliative Care Leadership Centers, and a facilitator for multiple communication programs including Vitaltalk, PalliTalk, Ariadne Labs' Serious Illness Care, and REDE to Communicate. He is a member of the American Board of Internal Medicine's Hospice and Palliative Medicine board examination item approval committee.
