DISCUSSION HILIGHTS:

The recent DMPonline user group meeting prominently featured discussions around the anticipated Usage Dashboard. This tool is aimed at improving administrative efficiency by providing insightful and actionable data management statistics.

1. Dashboard Features Overview:

- The Usage Dashboard is designed to provide detailed metrics on DMP activities such as the number of plans created, feedback requested, and visibility settings, along with user engagement and compliance information.
- The presentation of these statistics will be highly informative, aiding administrators in monitoring and enhancing data management processes and administrators will be able to download these.

2. Content vs. Visuals:

- We would like to emphasise that the discussion was on the content and specificity of the statistics rather than the graphical or visual aspects of the dashboard.

3. Customisation and Standardisation:

- While administrators will have the ability to customise which statistics are displayed using toggles, the order in which these stats appear will remain fixed. This standardisation will help maintain consistency across uses, ensuring all users interpret the dashboard similarly.

4. Accessibility and Navigation:

- Administrators will access the Usage Dashboard through a specific navigation path within the platform: by accessing the Admin tab, selecting 'Organisational Details,' and then navigating to the newly added 'User's Dashboard' tab.
- This method ensures that control over dashboard configurations is centralised and streamlined.

5. Technical Implementation:

- The discussion also addressed technical implementation, with mock-ups provided to illustrate how the dashboard might look and operate. While design is not the focus, the user interface will be developed to ensure ease of use and accessibility.

Key Action Items

- **Community Feedback:** Continued feedback is sought from the community, specifically focusing on desirable content and functionalities that enhance administrative capabilities.
- **Engagement in Development:** Members interested in contributing more directly to the dashboard's development are encouraged to get in touch with as dmponline@dcc.ac.uk.

Update on latest development work

1. Main priorities: integration, automation

2. Released integration in July 2024 - DOI for Research Outputs, integration with OpenAIRE Graph API, read [news item](#) on DCC website
3. Working on API V2, to replace and combine functionalities of current API V0 and V1
4. Sectigo SSL certificates
 - Switched from Let's Encrypt to Sectigo SSL certificates
 - Thank you for your prompt action!
 - FAO enhanced customers:
 - Sectigo certificates are currently renewed once a year, but there are discussions about renewal every three months, which will be inconvenient for you. You will have to ask your IT department every three months to ask them to update the CNAME entry.
 - Up until now, we have offered our customers fully customised URLs, with URLs based on their organisation's domain, e.g. <https://dmponline.eur.nl/> for Erasmus University.
 - From now on, we will offer wildcard style URLs based on dmponline.dcc.ac.uk . Your URL will be myuniversity.dmponline.dcc.ac.uk .
 - Customers who already have a fully customised URL, based on their University's domain, may consider switching to wildcard URLs and putting a forwarding rule in place from their current URL. Some of you have already commented that this will not be well received and we appreciate that your fully customised URL, based on the institution domain may now be too well established to be changed. **ACTION:** DMPOnline to follow up with enhanced customers re URL. **Done.**
 - **ACTION:** DMPOnline team must send better instructions on renewal of certificates, perhaps a step by step guide on what needs to happen. IT departments seem to use different terminology and found our instructions confusing. We should also give an indication of who normally deals with this, e.g. network security. IT departments are typically quite large and it's not always clear whose remit it is to put SSL certificates in place.
5. DMP IDs
 - Plan IDs are displayed on Project Details page (tab)
 - The plan ID assigned by DMPOnline, will become uneditable (it currently is editable). The field will be called 'DMPOnline ID'
 - Will add an additional plan ID field, which users can edit. The entry can be, for example, an institutional plan or grant ID and, in the long run, it could become an integration. Field will probably be called 'Project ID'.
 - Both ID fields will come with tool tips (explanations on mouse-over).
 - Comments and questions:
 - Will the additional plan ID be numbers only? No, it will be editable by user and can follow organisation naming conventions for research projects, if they exist.
 - Manual project IDs can be a bit dangerous because they can change between different copies of a DMP. Not every university has its own CRIS system where all projects are registered. Answer: True but some universities are already using the manual ID; ideally DMPs should be continuously updated not copied; the manual ID could become an

integration. **ACTION:** Diana to follow up with Theresa Kieselbach who raised this concern. COMPLETED case no 00078709.

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Adding new standard questionnaires to DMPs

- We put forward the proposal of adding Ethics Assessments and Data Protection Impact Assessments
- These would be added as new tabs in a DMP (or new phases to a template, if you like)
- Proposal was generally well received, some users expressed the view that DMPs are incomplete without them
- Some users enquired about the option of leaving them out (not all DMPs require DPIAs). Answer: yes. These standard questionnaires would be implemented as phases in a template and currently, phases can be easily deleted. Alternatively, we can use tick boxes to switch questionnaires on or off. Organisations may change their mind - they may not want to add questionnaires as part of DMPs at this stage, but may wish to do so later on.
- The questionnaires can be customised by the institution to suit their needs. This is important!

Issues raised:

- Questionnaires can be quite long. A university that shall remain unnamed has a mighty 24-page long DPIA questionnaire. We may need to come up with a standard, more succinct and broadly accepted questionnaire first (if such a thing exists), which institutions can then customise.
- There is a great overlap between questions in DMPs and Ethics assessments and DPIAs. Use a mapping facility to retrieve answers to similar questions from DMP into Ethics/DPIAs.
- This should at least be implemented in a modular way. Especially with the EU AI Act coming into force, we may want a way to add on a separate questionnaire for that. **ACTION:** Diana to get in touch with Richard Grimes to check what he meant by modular. COMPLETED Case no 00078713
- Menu on the DMP will get quite busy, with an increased number of tabs (Project Details, Contributors, Plan Overview, Write Plan, Research Outputs, Share, Download). May have to implement menu expansion and contraction, e.g. display key items of a DMP, and hide additional facilities behind the well established ellipsis menu ('three dots' symbol), which lets users know there is more to come.

Updates to funder templates (skip to minute 54:30 in video recording)

Topics covered (see slides 21-25)

- Currently revising all templates
- Adding new funders and their templates to the system. **ACTION:** All. If you have funders in your country that require DMPs and have DMP templates already, please sent them to us.
- Implementing UKRI funder templates as two-phase templates in DMPonline, with an Initial DMP to be entered in The Funding System (TFS at <https://funding-service.ukri.org/>) at grant application stage. Ongoing discussions with our each of the funders.

Questions put to the audience were:

- Does the Initial DMP phase in DMPOnline look similar enough to what is available in The Funding System (TFS)
- Should we also include the Ethics section of TFS grant applications in the Initial DMP

Comments:

- It was suggested we should add the Ethics section under the DMP as it encourages researchers to think early about ethical issue. Also, funders like AHRC seem to 'seem to have squashed data management into the section on ethics and responsible research'? There were also comments that in TFS the section on Ethics and Responsible Research and Innovation (RRI) on ESRC grant-application form is basically the same question as the section on Data Management on Sharing. Note: will raise this with research councils.
- There were questions on why would you fill in the grant-application stage (= proposed Initial DMP) in DMPOnline rather than in TFS. Answer by one user is because it gives researchers some structure, and it keeps everything related to a project in one place. DMPOnline team would add: Initial DMP can also be sent for feedback before submission.

Questions/Discussion

Question 1: Will there be new features added to the API v2 or is the focus on reaching parity with the current v0 and v1 APIs?

Answer: API V2 will provide all existing functionality of API V0 and V1 and will comply with common standards. In addition, it will enable user-level authentication.

Question 2: We have an institutional template which we are considering updating the template questions and guidance. Please can you offer advice on whether it is better to edit the existing template and guidance or create a new version 2 template with guidance? With either option, is there any impact on plans created on what will be the previous template?

Answer: If we just update questions, I suggest you use the same template. It will be similar enough and the template versioning feature will keep track of when the questions were updated. Any old plans created on this template won't be affected; all plans are based on the version of the template they were created on, new questions won't just appear.

When we add the new phases (i.e. new standard questionnaires on ethics and DPIA) then perhaps the template is different enough to create a whole new template. You can use the copy template function for this.

Question 3: Before adding new questions, have you reasoned about what kind of answers you may get and what essential new information they will bring? (Supposedly, still free text answers, right?)

Answer: About free text: yes, but this is a consultation, we are open to suggestions on how we can narrow the focus of these questions, use more conditional questions, standardise answers. With regards to the second question (have you reasoned about what kind of answers you may get), I'll ask DCC management about this and get back to you. **ACTION:** Diana to get in touch with Joakim to find out more about what he had in mind and how we could cut down on free text. COMPLETED case no 00078718 (case assigned to his colleague, Maria).

Question 4: Is it possible to associate a funder with multiple templates? It would be nice if when a user creates a new plan and selects, for example, NWO they can choose between the NWO template and our institutional template (which is also accepted by NWO).

Answer: Not at the moment, but we can look into this. NWO is a particular case because it asked universities to create institutional templates as customised version of the NWO template.

Question 5: Angeliki Andrikopoulou: With regard to updates on funder templates, would it be possible for the EUniWell DMP template to be added to the list of templates? Template and guidance:

Answer: Yes. Thank you so much for sending the source documentation. Added to our Jira issue on the development board. **ACTION:** Diana to get in touch with Angeliki. COMPLETED case no 00078719

Question 6: Not about funder templates, but I wasn't able to join the workshops on March 19th, unfortunately, but I was wondering when the previously discussed update on the create plan wizard will be effective. The missed tickbox for 'no funder associated etc.' is still our main issue for our users; we are waiting for just the list of available template with the institutional template being the first option to be implemented.

Answer: your proposal is noted. We will consider it when drafting the feature specification. **ACTION:** Diana to add Mirjam Brullemans' proposal to Jira issue for new plan creation wizard.

Administrators cannot remove users, DMPonline team can de-active user, or deactivate user if we have been specifically asked

Questions

- Chris Gibson: Questions Identifiers - Can an org admin add their own Questions Identifiers to a customised template? Answer: Yes, an org admin can add Question Identifiers to a template when customising a funder template. It just needs to be unique to that template.
- Chris Gibson: ROR workflow and if the user would have a responsibility - The answer was that to the end user nothing will change. They will just see a bigger list of organisations when creating an account or when adding a collaborator to the DMP. And this system will add a new organisation to the tool organisation list when the user selects an org that is not present. But this will be all done behind the screen.
- Lisa Olsson: Under Project Details, the new tick-box "Research outputs may have ethical concerns": Can we (admins) export that information somehow to identify sensitive projects? Could that info be a column in the export of plans? (If that is a valuable idea). Can also be retrieved through API.
- Joakim Philipson: will the discovery service affect our URLs? Answer: No.
- Petra van Overveld: discovery service, do we need to change something, because we have an automatic login via SURFconext? Answer: No.
- Andres Ramos Padilla: For the DOI in the Research outputs, will this automatically read the metadata information and put it in the DMP? Answer: yes, retrieving the DOI will also enable automatic filling in of metadata (e.g. name of dataset, repository) at both the create and edit/update stage.
- Jeroen Rombouts: Are there international standards available or being developed for the question ID's?

- To have an inventory of selected project outputs

- Managing collaborations
- Mid-term reviews (PhD, Funded, ...)
- DMP should be updated to get data to the right/trusworthy data repository - DMP reveals if the data is suitable for the repo (are legal issues considered, are datatypes suitable etc)
- If offered data storage throughout the data life cycle
- If there was funding for data write and curation , then that could be attached to an updated DMP.
- Factor in reminders into DMPOnline to review it - could ask researchers to identify reminder points themselves
- Integrated review of DMP, Ethics and privacy (deduplication) and automating requests for services from answers provided

Comments:

Chris Gibson: we should create API to enable organisations to write metadata in DMPonline on behalf of their researchers. By this he meant finding identifiers that map across different systems and using them in DMPonline. For example, we could use a [RAID identifier](#) as a Project ID. Several participants agreed with Chris's idea. ACTION: Diana to approach Chris to ask for further information.

Nina Lewin: we have to specifically build into the DMP the concept of change and that change is not a problem.

Nina Lewin: *How are safe havens different from TRE are they archives?*

Answer from Joy: I believe they're the the same, different terms for the same thing. So a trusted research environment (TRE) and a safe haven are technically, used in the same context. Whether they store archive longer term is down to the individual environment.

Another answer: My understanding is that a safe haven is another term for TRE. Our current theory is known as the data safe haven but but TRE is the genetic terminology for it. We do sometimes archive them long term if they can't be openly shared, though it's primarily data storage during the project for sensitive data.

Note FAO DMPonline team:

Joakim commented: Sometimes maybe Generalist repositories (e.g. from the GREI collaboration) may "strike higher" on the Interoperability (of metadata) of FAIR, than "narrow" institutional or domain specific repositories? Note: I think Joakim's comment was in response to the comment that Research Outputs feature retrieves list of repositories from [re3data](#) and the search facility returns generalist repositories first.

Questions

Mark: Can you give an example of what does not work the way you want? Research Output?

- UI needs improvement. The repository search feature can be improved. Repo search should feed the metadata standard.
- Suggestion from Nina: also if you are in a university then the institutional repository should be prepopulated
- Chris: DataCite metadata schema might help with definitions of output types for some cases. Also other schema may provide useful definitions.
- Mark: would be good to have definitions for the types of datasets
- Soile: we cannot add institution's repo to Re3Data because they have a different registration policy which stops us from adding to it (re3data's registration policy says that repo should have focus on research data; many organisations institutional repositories includes publications and data)
- Nina: to make things more complex crossref has dataset DOI. and many IRs would have Soile IR problem

Proposal for a new feature from DMPTuuli - question identifiers (IDs)

Chris: We prefix all our DMP templates with our locally created 'Outline' section that asks mostly multiple choice questions. We'd like to automate harvesting of those responses - perhaps with an API. Is it possible to enable an API that we can use to interrogate our own, locally created institutional section? (Is this the same as, or similar to Tuuli?)

- Yes, it is possible but an additional system (similar to what DMPTuuli has) will be required to extract and analyse data from the API
- Joakim: Thanks Jari and Matti, very interesting. We at Stockholm University have our own local maDMP-template, with multiple choice questions, radio buttons etc. (that validates against the RDA DMP Common Standard madmp-schema-1.1.json) , and then use - as you - API v.0 to harvest and transform the DMPs to RDA DMP common standard , using also a local tailormade schematron schema and an xslt-file... 2. Specification for machine-actionable Grant ID field

Can a user than still choose the template of the institute? As some funders allow this and a institutional template is usually better fitting / fine-tuned. - *We can still have the template associated but we have this additional option, associating the template with the API - they would be compatible*

Asking for all of this information before selecting a template would be ofputting.

Sometimes a DMP is associated to more than one grant. Worth considering?
That's correct. We should add another funder, we will be writing more details specification and share with the community.

Other issue we might have is the **terminology**. It can be in DMPonline and funder systems and we need to be precise for the user - we need to ensure that the things will move smoothly across the systems.

In **DMPonline** - Data management plans = sometimes referred as projects

For funders they refer to grants - and grants can fund several projects - it has more layers - this is why we are looking for more examples of APIs to see what terminology to use in order to avoid confusion. We can avoid helpdesk to avoid confusion

Can a user than still choose the template of the institute? As some funders allow this and a institutional template is usually better fitting / fine-tuned.
If the plan is never funded all works as it worked before. But we have been asked to link funded projects to the database of the funder. It will not be a mandatory field though.

Margaret from ZonMW This is the M4M template for Project Admin. that can be considered as a controlled vocab for administrative metadata -

Grant ID - would be a major addition to the metadata scheme they use and developed. They worked with Oxford University, they want to have standardised metadata set

Can a user still choose a template of the institute? - the answer is yes. Template selection will be looked at and improved. In netherlands they want to have the institutional template to be the preferred one by default

Joakim - at Stockholm University they like they flexibility to choose which template to use. They have their institutional template, but many users need to use funder templates because that's where they got their grants from and at the top of that they have their swedish research council one which is more text oriented

We should have machine actionable features but we cannot deploy them at the expense usability - so create plan wizard should be potentially work along the grant ID feature

When the grant number is entered the project name does not need to be rewritten. The user should then be prompted - e.g. your project name will be overwritten - are you happy with this

Ida - if the user fills the form - the user might not want to even be asked whether the title should be overwritten, but there might be a case when they have been given the number afterwards so that might not be an issue

If I was an end user I would get frustrated if I filled out numbers in the form and got to grant ID. When that is filled out I get suggestions of the previous fields I have already spent time on filling out.

Think it's a matter of communication/dialog with the user, order of fields and if they have an old form they want to reuse or start from scratch.

Maybe the API will not fill the form, but can create suggestions to be dragged and dropped into the right field. (?)

I would suggest that the grant ID would be the first thing (on top of the page) to fill out when creating a new template and have a grant ID in place. Then the API gives suggestions of the possible fields to fill out (e.g. drag and drop)

3. Machine-actionable grant ID field implementation at OPIDoR

Presenter: Christine Jaquemot

OPIDoR

In 2016 they launched DMP OPIDoR based on the ROadmap code in 2020 - they launched RE3 they added new data models

The feature is available for all templates

At the moment they have information from french national funder but they are developing to get information from other funders

- They display the title, acronym and grant id - cause it was better for the user
- Once selected they display the title, acronym, abstract of the project and they have all the information in french and in english , there is information about the funder (french agency identifier and link to their policy) and link to the grant ID is there too
- French identifier is highly recommended but is not always filled out

It is not direct call to the funder - because their funder does not have an API

They deposit the information and french repository and try to do it (once a month) and OPIDoR collects the information and that includes the title coming and the grant id and that's how they can show the list and they have web service on the side

Is this compatible with JSON v1.1 API schema - they do not do the validation, ORCID, ROR they do not use this just yet - there are some requirements that are still difficult to comply with - they have a quite lot of information that is filled within the RDA common standard

- To perform the validation is to keep track what is missing and what could be do the encourage the users to fill this better e.g. ORCID (some people do not have it, but that might prompt them to make one or some have several ones) - it is very encouraging there is still a lot of work needed

 - 1 for grant number and
 - 2 for the URL.
 - Are grant numbers on a European level harvested? For checks on consistency?
 - plsterlini:
 - When we mint DOIs for data with datacite the Grant URL is included in the metadata. These can be hard to find as they are not included in publications - but they are helpful
 - New plan creation process
 - Petra:
 - For us it would be great if our own template is the first choice for users.
 - RSpace integration (includes changes to API or new API)
 - Mark:
 - Will there be a time when the new API is introduced but the older one(s) are still available? To allow for transition? We use the two current API's for our own systems to extract data.

- We use only v0 + direct DMPexport (JSON; which I believe gives essentially the same info as API v1) for our own template.

 - Diana:
 - Joy Davidson at DCC is involved with FI project
 - she is working on guidelines for trusted repositories
 - we are working with FI project to align RO feature with it
 - Diana:
 - Is everyone happy with the [design of the] new plan creation wizard?
 - Mark:
 - funders might want to edit their grant id to agree with a DOI standard
 - grant id number generation could feed into the URL
 - Joakim:
 - good we are going in direction of more machine-actionable outputs
 - and good we are getting an integration with ROR
 - would be good to have alignment with metadata scheme and RO feature
 - will be difficult to do given number of templates out there
 - has taken time for repositories to get there
 - maybe we should narrow down the number of templates first
 - we have our own templates and so do not promote the RO feature
 - repos can provide metadata standard plus licences
 - we don't ask for metadata standards because they can be inferred from the repository

Introduction

- latest activities from DMPonline team
 - Research Outputs (RO) feature
 - Diana summarised that:
 - many in select user group not ready for RO feature to be deployed yet
 - users want:
 - more guidance on screen
 - guidance on what RO is for
 - guidance on when RO should be completed
 - RO to be completed at end of project
 - institutions to be able to:
 - customise RO feature
 - enable/disable RO feature
 - we'll do more development and have another meeting with select user group
 - we'll start small by adding text to top of RO page
 - then we'll move to adding guidance to RO page
 - integration with RSpace (<https://www.researchspace.com/>)
 - RSpace is a data repository service
 - integration would allow users with RSpace repos to cross-reference them with their DMPs
 - an API will need to be developed
 - specification to be written

1. DMPonline plan Sharing and Co-editing

- Diana:
 - gave a demo of the sharing and co-editing features in a plan
 - acknowledged that the term “contributors” can cause confusion
 - welcomed feedback/suggestions for any aspects of these features
- Lisa Olsson, Umeå uni, Jürg Brendan, Soile - would like cover sheet ticked by default
 - Glenys explained this feature will be present in the next release
- Mirjam - current roles for contributor too specific

- Diana suggested having an “Other” option and an associated free-text field for the user to list the roles there, but Mirjam said this could result in a proliferation of roles
- Mirjam said she specifies roles in the “Write Plan” section instead
- Mirjam suggested making the Contributors > Roles field optional (i.e. not mandatory)
- Carolin Rebernick - collaborators should be added to the pdf/download option. (Lisa Olsson: by default, preferably.)
 - Diana acknowledged that this was a good point and that we can look into it
 - Marta suggested that we could have a checkbox for whether to include the collaborators in the PDF export
- Minka - history of contributors (could it be added in plan versioning), some users ask for it
- Chris Gibson - there is a possible overlap between contributors and collaborators. For example, a Principal Investigator might delegate responsibility for writing and maintaining a plan to a colleague in the research team

2. Discussion: who owns the plans?

- Chris
 - most universities have an IP policy, i.e. typically, IP created by an employee belongs to the university, subject to exceptions
 - typically, one exception is sponsored research where ownership is determined in accordance with the terms of a research agreement / contract
 - Chris’ institution deals with plan owners leaving his institution with the following policies with respect to plans:
 - a plan must have at least two owners, i.e. the owner and at least one co-owner
 - leaver gives all relevant colleagues permissions on the plan
 - leaver removes themselves from the plan
- Soile
 - users/researchers have full rights (copyright perspective), but the model is changing so that institutions have parallel rights and funders require rights clearance between the research and the organisation.
 - The biggest universities already have procedures in place.
 - For example, when new staff join, they sign a transfer of rights agreement. These agreements cover research data and materials, inventions (patents etc.) - publications are excluded.
- Carolin
 - in Sweden, universities are considered as part of the state
 - so all DMPs created at a university are considered publically owned documents
 - there is a legal requirement for any member of the public to access those documents
 - Lisa and Ida also agree
 - the plan is saved with the project and belongs to the project

- and if the project is publically funded, then the plan falls under open-science policy
- Angeliki Andrikopoulou
 - the DMP probably should be treated like other data derived from a project - who owns the data after the researcher is leaving the University- the research data policies state that the university is the owner of the data, so this could be applied to the DMPs, yet it is not always that simple.
 - I think that the individual departments that host the research projects should have a say on the issue.
 - Libraries are not able to make the decisions on such matters, they could just support and guide the research community to meet the relevant policies.
 - from a technical point of view, the current DMPonline system is meeting the requirements
- Following Chris' example of when a user leaves
 - this is an issue that comes up with many documents not just a DMP (Lisa), this would require institutions to have a policy as well not just dmp policies.

3. AOB

- Diana Sisu:
 - We are often asked for data-dumps by institutes; we say no for now. How does everyone feel about that?
 - Mirjam: You shouldn't allow for data-dumps; leave that to the institutes.
- Mirjam:
 - I struggle to find plans on the dashboard.
 - I would like to have an "Owner(s)" column added to the dashboard.
 - This could replace the "Shared" column if everyone would be happy with that.

4. Summary

- Users would like to include contributors and collaborators in the dmp download.
- Contributors roles are too high-level and need to be more detailed.
- Diana will be in touch soon to set up the next meeting for mid-July.
- Diana will hold a meeting with funders, with a view to understanding their requirements.

Plan Versioning

Introduction

A proposal for a plan versioning facility was put forward and discussed at the user group in November 2021. This is a follow-up to that meeting.

The DMPRoadmap team thought about implementation of the facility and got stuck at a key step: create new plan version. The original proposal enabled the user to create too many versions for a plan and it was unclear what they would be useful for. This user meeting is bringing back to you a key question: why do we need plan versions?

Discussion

- General advice: keep the plan versioning feature simple from the start, more features can be added later, if needed.
 - 'I agree, Danny. I would also say that there is a user education/training piece in this. Rather than account for every workflow eventuality, the reality is that if you are using a system you will need to amend your procedures to use the system effectively. If the system tries to cover everything it will end up being overly customised and a bit of a patchwork quilt.' Lindsay Dowling
- When do we need versions:
 - Most expressed a requirement for keeping a copy of the plan that they had provided feedback on, i.e. a kind of before and after feedback versions of a plan.
 - The plan owner can decide if new versions are needed but keep number of triggers as low as possible. (Danny and others)
 - The version I'd like to have is the submitted version - we encourage living document DMPs, but it can be important to know what you said to the funding bodies originally for final reports so you can address why it changed. (Beth)
- Why do we need a before and after feedback version:
 - Need to know the reason behind the comment at the time of commenting (Danny, Lindsay). At the moment, user can change answers in the same version of the plan. If the org admin returns to plan to see why they left a particular comment, comments and answers are no longer linked.
 - Not concerned if comments have been incorporated in the plan. From the admin's perspective, the trace of comments is important for auditing purposes (Danny).
- When should a new version be triggered - workflow and changes to UI:
 - Can a new version be triggered when feedback is requested (Chris Gibson) that way the admin can have a copy of it for which they add comments.
 - Other users suggested a new version to be triggered after feedback has been provided, i.e. when the org admin clicks review complete button. Note: since many of you asked about this, not every comment would trigger a version, we never had that in mind!
 - When DMP feedback is requested, send user message asking if they want to proceed.
 - Lock dmp, until feedback complete. Example platform that locks submission during review, Yoda storage platform, <https://yoda.yale.edu/> . (Danny).
 - Retract plan after sending feedback request? (Mark) - *possible but this would make it difficult for versioning.*
 - Some org admins are also interested in seeing the version submitted to the funder and version at the end of the project. Perhaps they can be marked in a way that makes them easy to spot - flagged? (Lindsay, Chris)

- Note that there is a difference between notification for administrators that a plan has been submitted for review and that a new version of plan has been created.
- Would older versions be editable? Mark says editing older versions will be confusing, especially while reviewing etc. Answer: To be considered. The number of actions that can be performed on each version would be very limited.
- If a new version is created will the plan ID remain the same. Answer: Yes. There will be a version ID, based on the plan ID.
- Who should be able to create versions of a plan:
 - Only owner of plan should be allowed to create versions.
 - If plan versioning is linked only to before and after feedback, then this could be built into the workflow and have automatically generated ('triggered') plan versions only, but not manual.
- Additional aspects of plan versioning:
 - Would a new version also create a new version on the meta-level? Answer: yes, API v0 and v1 would cater for versions.
 - Will we have to come up with a single solution, one size fits all approach? Answer: Yes.
 - Training for both org admin and end user will be required. Answer: Yes. We will provide both user groups and online training material, e.g. videos, new instructions for org admins on the wiki page.
 - A suggestion from Joakim - comments cannot be downloaded now, but if they could be, then the admin can download the DMP with comments after they add comments, thus versioning wouldn't be required for comments.
 - Can comments be locked so that it cannot be deleted so that admins wouldn't have to download a history of comments? (Lindsey Myers).
 - Format of older versions: don't want pdf only of old versions, because API is used to download plans and keep on register, to get an idea of how plans change over time. PDF wouldn't help in this case. Would like to retrieve data and make sure that it isn't editable. (Mark)
 - How will this affect the API? Get all versions or specific versions? (Mark) Answer: New API call might be needed to get older versions. The current API will get the latest version. Will know more once development starts.
 - An extra field might be useful at the meta level for a DMP indicating how many versions there are, if interesting? (Mark)

Summary

Plan versioning:

- Start simple. Offer as few versions as possible and make it clear why versions are used for.
- At the moment, the main demand for versioning is based on feedback. Users would like to preserve the version of the plan (i.e. answers) on which the feedback was given, and version of plan after feedback.
- There is a worry that in the initial proposal, there are too many triggers for versioning system - cut down on trigger points and offer as few versions as possible.

- Make it clear who can create new versions - possibly limit this to plan owner and administrators. This would make sense based on the current demand for versioning (i.e. before and after feedback).
- Ideally, only the most up-to-date version should be editable.
- If older versions are editable, ensure the user interface makes this clear via the actions offered in the drop-down menu.

- We will need new notification messages for 'new version of x plan has been created'. These would be different in timing and wording for end user and org admin.

Plan feedback process:

Review of feedback process is also on the agenda for development but with a later delivery date of 31 October. Given that the plan versioning seems to be driven by feedback, it may be that the feedback workflow has to be reviewed in parallel with (if not instead of?) plan versioning. Some suggestions for improvement were:

- Ability to download comments perhaps via an API. This would mean that every admin could create new processes for how to keep a copy of original answers given by end user and comments given by org admin. This could also mean that we would not need a plan versioning facility.
- Lock plan during feedback, i.e. user would not be able to make changes while the plan is submitted for feedback. Issue user with warning that of type 'Your plan is about to be submitted for review and you would not be able to edit it. Do you wish to submit for review? Yes/No'. Give some visual clue on the dashboard that the plan can't be edited - make it faint, or mark it as 'Locked for review'. Some suggested that locking may be a bit restrictive for users and that we should perhaps enable the user to retrieve plan from feedback (however, this would make it difficult for versioning).

Comments and feedback:

- New workflow relies on users to select the right template from those on offer. Users can make mistakes when choosing.
- If several templates are on offer, user may assume all templates are OK ('all templates are equal') to use for their DMP, and this is not the case. Funders normally expect users to submit funder template.
- Organisations (universities) can also be primary funders. Users should be able to enter them in the funder field. ACTION: DMPonline team to consider adding universities to 'funder' table.

Question from Petra van Overveld: Will it be possible that if you have a subscription that your own template will be default?

A: If the user has entered their primary research organisation, their organisation template is the default template. If the organisation has more than one template, all organisation templates will be offered for selection.

In a way Petra's question is about the ability to set default templates and is similar to Nicholas Syrotiuk's suggestion:

'I think one solution might be to allow the admin user to decide what DMPs are displayed based on the DMP user's input.' This would be difficult to implement

This is a new tab on the Plan where users enter the following information:

- Data type (e.g. dataset, software, image, etc, options from DataCite), name and a description of the output, size (if applicable), whether or not it contains sensitive info or PII, what the initial access level will be (e.g. open, restricted, closed) and the anticipated publication date.
- Select the repositories they intend to preserve the data object in (e.g. Dryad, Zenodo. List of repositories comes from the RE3DATA registry, <https://www.re3data.org/> .
- Select metadata standards (e.g. Dublin Core), options from the RDA Metadata standards catalog, <https://rdamsc.bath.ac.uk/> .
- Select an appropriate licence, options come from the SPDX license registry, <https://spdx.org/licenses/> .

Fields such as repositories, metadata and licences are machine actionable, while fields such as data type follow glossaries in established RDM resources such as DataCite and the RDA metadata.

Benefits:

- The information entered in the Research Outputs tab will provide organisations with statistics on data generated by their users, e.g. how much data containing sensitive information is generated, where it is stored, size, etc.
- Encourages users to return to plan to add new information about the data generated by the project.

Comments and feedback

- Risk of duplicating information - many existing organisation and funder templates already ask users to enter information about data generated by the project. It can be irritating to users to have to enter this information in two different places.
- Prone to error - users will be entering this information without the guidance provided by the template. For example, not all repositories listed on the RE3DATA registry are suitable (e.g. some do not provide persistent identifiers).
- It is not clear to the user when they have to fill in this information. DMPs are normally submitted early on, typically before application for funding. Information on data types will be available at later stages of the project.
- Mark Bruyneel enquired whether some of the fields, e.g. metadata can be included in the templates. ACTION: DMPonline team to investigate this.
- Users generally agreed the feature is useful, subject to addressing issues above.

Thank you to Chris Gibson who proposed a solution:

Add contextual guidance on the page to explain:

- Whether it is mandatory or optional to fill in the Research Outputs page. It is optional.
- When should this information be filled in. It is recommended it is filled in before the end of the project.
- Whether the Research Outputs information should be included in the DMP sent to the funder as part of the grant application - No.

We should add a text box at the top of the page, the first thing the user sees, that explains all of the above. Textbox should be customisable by organisations.

In addition, add a link to a document that explains the rationale for the feature:

- What is the benefit of entering this information?
- Who will use it and for what purpose.

ACTIONS:

- DMPonline team to take the points above to Roadmap meeting in December
- Diana to arrange meeting with Mark, Chris, Joakim, Lina, Greg Simpson to talk about ongoing development of the feature.

Summary

- Todd Matsumoto has kindly provided [customised DMPonline API code](#)

Comments on APIs:

- Text fields with even basic html coding (e.g. bullet point lists, numbered lists) can make it difficult to extract data
- Formatting such as tables are also difficult to process
- Design of the API fed back into design of templates, for example, formulating questions. This resulted in more multiple choice questions and fewer free-text questions, with shorter answers.

Questions:

- **Can we number sections/questions to start from 0?**
Answer: it's a matter of usability. A list consisting of question 1, question 2, question 3, etc, makes sense to the user. A list consisting of question 0, question 1, question 2, etc, is less intuitive. If you tell the user they have 10 questions to answer, and they glance at the bottom of the list and say the last question is number 9, they would be confused. These are busy researchers, they won't have time to check. We want statistics but we mustn't sacrifice usability for it.
- **Can APIs return a list of plans that satisfy certain criteria, e.g. return plans where answer to question 'does this plan contain sensitive data' is 'yes'.**
Suggestion from Chris Gibson.
Answer: Yes. Need to write the code.
- **Question from Naeem - would it be possible to export a pdf via an API? Would we consider doing this in the future?**
Answer: No on both counts. It would be in effect like providing a data dump and we don't do this. Nonetheless, we will check with the wider DMPRoadmap team to see what their views are on this topic.

- Miriam Braskova: RSpace - is it on the roadmap (yes), what is the timeframe for it (unclear for now).

 - Participants thought this was a useful feature, particularly because it comes with a search facility by facets such as funder, subject, etc
 - Would like the facility to enable featured plans within an institution.
 - Plan being marked as 'featured' could work as an incentive for researchers and it may also improve the rate of published plans (getting researchers to publish their plans is a priority for organisations)
 11. Do you think at some point it would be needed to add the option for a DOI for a DMP? Answer: not sure DMP authors are comfortable with publishing their DMPs. We can look into this.

Update from the DMPonline team

One important thing to note is that DMPonline is now up to 62 customers, including major national contracts. This is becoming a big user community! DMPTuuli has over 50 organisations.

Versioning update

This refers to keeping track of versions of a particular data management plan (DMP).

The slides that give a summary of the proposed specification for the versioning facility are here:

Questions:

- Will new versions keep the original plan ID. Answer: yes. The URL will also include plan ID, as well as the plan details page.
- When downloading via the API (v0/v1), will there be a new parameter for version in the API? Answer: yes and it will be aligned with the machine actionable DMP standard. We've already looked at the concept of time stamps. We will make sure there will be some field in the API to identify versions.
- Will versions always be used? Or will there still be plans without versions? (user chooses to answer questions and save the answers but never hits the 'create version' button: is this still possible?). Answer: in this case the plan will be version 1.

- 'Version history' in action menu on my dashboard would be more clear than 'access version'? Answer: unclear yet, we will do some basic user testing to make sure the dashboard works.
- Versions will they be created automatically? Answer: there will be three ways to create versions - automatic, manual, and triggered by certain events.
- If I recall correctly, at present, if you copy a DMP, the new copy records the same DMP ID as the original DMP even though the new copy takes a different URL. Can this be fixed so that the URL and ID are always consistent? Answer: we will double-check this and it will be addressed by versioning so that different DMPs have different IDs.
- DMP title - can you modify it when you create a new version? Answer: the project title will remain the same, but the details, including plan title, can be changed.
- Will it be possible to link directly to a specific version (e.g., will each version have a unique URL)? Answer: unsure, but it must be possible since there is a URL. Must check with our developers. Participant states it must be 'essential' if it is to work with the API.
- But if I understand this sheet correctly, then you will only see the version of your template here? Answer: we have to look into this further. Admins need to know what version of the template a plan has been based on (e.g. whether a question has been answered).
- It would be useful to us to trigger a new version automatically when a plan is submitted for feedback, so that we could see the original we commented on not the text including their responses. (Bev, Sheffield)

Discussion:

- This looks great but we are concerned that there will be too many versions and too much data to back up. Answer: we are aware of this and looking into it. Our system already saves DMPs automatically in the background, as different versions.
- Versioning will also apply to test DMPs. Is this OK? Overall participants answer yes.

Overall, participants seem to approve of the plan, there are no negative comments to the proposed versioning facility.

 - It is already very helpful that we can print it, because at Dutch funders we also have to submit this info.
 - Suggestions for improvement: add related works in the 'Research outputs' tab, not the project details; synchronise with ORCID

- ‘Or, conversely, if you could also import an item (with DOI) from your ORCID record to populate the Research outputs (Repositories, Metadata standards - that are often linked to repositories, Licenses etc.) ...’
 - ‘our DMPs are all on private, so not a feature we need’. Note that having a plan visible is not a requirement for minting.
 - ‘If you can link it to the info on your ORCID page, is maybe also sufficient at first?’
- Questions:
 - The research outputs loaded on DMP tool will they be assigned a DOI? Answer: yes.
 - Would DMPonline facilitate then a landing page for the published plans? Answer: at the moment we are not a DataCite member, we would not be able to mint DMPs. Related question from Patricia: should we provide this as an interface but the actual minting would be provided at institutional level, e.g. your institutional repository? We could also integrate with Zenodo? No answer from users, but there seems to be less enthusiasm for minting.
 - How would DOI versioning be managed? If the DMP metadata is updated after minting the DOI, is a new DOI version automatically created? Answer: we don’t know, we will ask the CDL team and get back to you.

Overall, the ‘research outputs’ feature was better received than minting.

Issues discussed:

- First pitch - when you log in - so your profile info - e.g. your name, country, ORCID and other personal profile information comes through - so if you could connect different different systems and pass the personal information among the systems - similar to Surf login .Ray's comment Information we get from local IDP is very limited at the moment. Second level they are talking about is how do we interact with other systems e.g. personal information. Two pieces of work - one we can get from IDP and how do we interact with other systems to harvest useful information from them.
- Admin profiles to be used to automatically trigger signal admins on changes in dmps? It would also be convenient to only see those DMP's for a specific number of fields of science - another issue that requires making more out of pulling information from user profiles; dependent on versioning as well.
- The possibility to use Radio buttons for conditional routing. Radio buttons is an important feature and conditionality should work with them. Ray pointed out that the way we've implemented conditional questions is cumbersome and needs to be re-designed. This was also pointed out during the DMPonline usability exercise.
- Autosaving - e.g. conditional questions if we have radio buttons once they selected one of the options they have to hit save before it removed the conditional questions - they might not press save prior getting through the list - and these might have been eliminated. We need to revisit conditional questioning and how do we use it at the

moment. We should be able to go back and re-design the whole area and make sure this works much better. It is not fit for purpose at the moment. It needs revisiting in near future.

- Trigger version at specified actions, so it is possible to see what changes result from or are subsequent to which actions - this is to do with versioning.
- Chris Gibson - suggested to link two features: allow admins to comment proactively on a DMP (you don't have to wait for researcher to submit feedback request) would work well with versioning (if the admin gave feedback, what action did the researcher take as a consequence).
- Mark Bruyneel - implement triggers within the system, e.g. somebody fills in a field that says 'this is final' (completed a particular action in a version, or completed a DMP), then this triggers a notification to the org admin.

Petra: usually they write a DMP and hand it in to funder at start of project (v1), half-term review (v2), end of project review (v3)

Hanna: they need to archive the DMP, therefore they need a "mark/tag" that indicates which version was submitted to the funder and needs to be archived

Bev: don't add tag names e.g. 'submitted', because these names will mean different things to different people. Use a timeline - e.g. version before or after comments. Using a timeline would also be an indicator of time spent on a DMP. Should be able to export DMP with feedback.

Ray: it's clear that we will have to enable customisation for versioning because institutions will use this feature differently.

Mark: agrees with Bev that adding names could be confusing, so far we talk about stages after this is in a shape that it's ready for review, we also might need to add some versions before they are ready, export version for the comments - DMPonline might not be the system where versions that are sent off are kept (maybe if integrated with other systems, e.g. a CRIS).

Kerry: two different concepts: "track changes" for the document to understand who wrote what (not sure if possible - this might become difficult), another is the "versioning" where you take a snapshot of a version that is then

frozen/archived and cannot be changed, so any changes from them on are basically on a new copy.

Ray: by tracking changes we mean taking snapshots.

Rosa: "snapshot" triggered by the user, option to add a commit message to label it? That then triggers/follows up with an event (outside the system, step 2)

Patricia, Hanna, Rory: doesn't matter what you call the version (e.g. could be a number), just implement a versioning system, where old versions can still be accessed, and leave it to the institution to decide what to do with the versions (which can be done via the API, for example). It comes back to Ray's comment that institutions can customise what they do with their versions.

An additional point: different versions of a DMP can be used for different purposes e.g. version x was sent to funder, version y was archived.

Chris: agree with most things so far. If a researcher creates a version (by pushing a button) , they can add a little comment what they labelled. Also allow the admin to trigger a version with comment as well.

2. Integration with CRIS systems (37)

- Pure, Worktribe
- 7 different systems in Sweden
- CRIS systems are under development and institutions are also still testing which system works best for them

- CRISs don't have very well developed APIs, difficult to integrate with them; data repositories are better from this point of view
- We might address this as customisable API that export to various systems
- Information flow, which way?
- What information should be communicated through the API
- What's needed? Which metadata fields are needed for a CRIS system?
 - Do we need to add more fields to DMPonline?
 - API only exports JSON
- Soile pointed out that systems such as Pure can be difficult when it comes to data extraction.

3. Reworking guidance (28)

- Levels of guidance? (general advice/ detailed advice). This is for the org admin not for the ordinary user.
- Themed guidance - several universities are not using it because it becomes repetitive (i.e. if you have several questions on ethics, the guidance gets repeated). Unclear how to fix this.
- Mark Bruyneel suggested that it should be possible to choose specific vs general level of guidance for each question.
- Adding more granular guidance would require integration with guidance that is already on the system.

4. Allow admins to proactively comment on DMPs (26)

- Ray - this is to be implemented after we have a versioning system, then figure out workflows for feedback
