Location tips

Computers, projectors soft pre-install central installation, MAC filtering FWs Pay a visit the day before...

If you cannot find a place with computers, ask parents to bring comps. Or rent laptops.

Ask big SWs companies (IBM) to lend some laptops.

Highschools usually have laptops/Comp Labs. Maybe even Mindstorms.

Security - make sure that you have the same number of children at end like beginning. Best an isolated space / room, not a room in a school on Saturday where older kids are, if possible.

Do you need insurance? Depends on legislation.. US/Canada yes, Europe no. First Aid kit. E.g. in Holland it's mandatory to have someone having first aid training at an event with kids.

Pictures/Videos, approval doc signature, depending on legislation. Group Picture at end. Video tape kids demos, show parents. Ask for permission, could put sticker on badge.

Children Stickers with Group #. Groups Rotation Agenda!

Explain to adult trainers that it's not a networking event between them, but to help the children. Tell them that they don't need specific skills, just motivation. Mothers, teachers can come and help.

Help the kids to get started. e.g. Scratch assignments, as long as they are not disruptive, even they are having fun going off and creating something else than the assignment, let them.

How many trainers / kids? - 1 assistant per 5 children Remember you'll also need people to help with logistics for food, directions to toilets.

TV / News Papers / Radios - 1 week before, press release.. Journalists are busy. Not 2-3 months before, but press release 2 weeks before, and spam them 1 week before.

Online Facebook works best

Ask a small fee, just to make sure that if it's a sunny day parents actually do come.

Resend an email to the parents before the event.

Statistics, to let Devoxx4Kids know what's happening globally. Capture if parents have computers at home, how many girls vs. boys, etc (for the moment they have about 30% of girls).

Keep parents away from sessions, they are horrible. Repeated several times. Kids will be different, they'll want their kids to be the best, it's stressful. BUT:

Children love showing their RESULTS, plan a "show and tell" demo at the end Embrace parents that want to help as a volunteer

Danish Devoxx4kids disagrees - they do family events on Sundsay, involving parents to train. Maybe better to continue at home? Better for smaller groups, 25 kids, 20 parents. You don't need insurance then..

Format / length - full day, say 10-16h!
