On December 26 2021, I personally visually inspected and evaluated the vehicle described below for the purpose of providing an estimation of the vehicle's cash/fair market value today. I inspected the vehicle's exterior, interior, chassis, and engine compartment. A mechanical evaluation was conducted where possible. The evaluation is based upon authenticity, preservation/ restoration, maintenance and/or replacement costs.

Mileage: 18,389 was the mileage shown on the odometer (It has likely turned over at least once). The

speedometer is currently not working.

Special Features

This is an ex-fire truck converted into a car hauler with a Hodges style ramp body. The current owner has owned this truck for approximately 5 years.



Engine/Engine Compartment: (Overall Condition Grade#4+) 272 Y block bored to 283 cubic inches. The cylinder heads have recently been replaced. Has a new clutch slave cylinder. The engine has the crossover exhaust that is factory for the 272 Y block. A Holley 2 barrel carburetor is installed on the factory intake manifold. The fuel pump has been replaced recently. It has been upgraded to a spin on oil filter. It has been upgraded to an electronic ignition system. The radiator has been recored.







Chassis & Drivetrain: (Overall Condition Grade #4+) Equipped with a 5 speed manual transmission. The tires have recently been replaced and they still have a lot of tread left on them. The wheels have been powder-coated black. The brake wheel cylinders and the brake master cylinder have been recently replaced. The undercarriage/frame has minimum surface rust on it. The wood for the bed storage boxes is in good condition.

Interior: (Overall Condition Grade #4+) The seats have been recovered by Rankin Upholstery with black vinyl. The factory instrument cluster is in good condition. All gauges work as they should except for the speedometer. There is an aftermarket amp meter installed. The factory heater works. There is a cowboy hat holder installed on the factory headliner. The floor mounted, foot operated headlamp dimmer switch works as it should. There is some pitting on the interior door and window handles. The windows roll up and down smoothly.

Exterior: (Overall Condition Grade #4+) The front and rear windows have new seals by Classic Upholstery and Glass Co. Upgraded LED light installed on the bed. The truck has the rare factory hood scoop that was available for the 1957 series Ford Trucks. The front bumper has the "Square Diamond Plate" on the top side (this can be used as a step when servicing the engine). The dual (left and right) spot/search lamps are in working condition. All of the holes on the roof (for the fire truck lights) have been filled in and the roof repainted white. There is some pitting on the exterior door handles and the spot lamps. The right hand side cab handle is rusted to the point that there is almost no chrome left on it.



Summary/Comments

The overall condition rating for this Ford F600 Car Hauler is a #4+. It is a working car hauler. For comparables, I looked at firetrucks of the same vintage, Ford F600 trucks of all types, and car haulers of all makes and models. Car haulers (these had the most number online for sale or sold prices) ranged from under \$10,000 up to just over \$90,000 USD. Mecum Auctions had the most car hauler "sold price" data online. Most of the Mecum car haulers were rated as a #3 or #2 vehicle. Ford F600 trucks from the 1950s to the 1970s ranged from just over \$2,000 up to the mid to upper teens in asking price and or actual sale price. There was other price data found online for the F600 (slightly newer model year) that ranged from the \$30,000 up to the mid \$50,000 range. Similar vintage fire trucks were also looked at for comparables. The fire trucks had an upper sale price or asking price of about \$10,000.00 USD. All of these were looked at just for comparable data since there were no 1957 Ford F600 Car Haulers for sale or any sold prices found online at the time of the appraisal. NADA and Hagerty did not have any price data on the 1957 Ford F600. The current "starting price" for a Hodges car hauler bed is \$7,295.00 USD from Hodges Custom Haulers.

After careful evaluation of this vehicle, based on my expertise and experience and after reviewing NADA, Hagerty Valuation Tool, Collector Car Auction Results, the Internet, reviewing comparables, etc. and after consulting with other Professional Appraisers, museums, and automotive experts, etc., when necessary, I appraise (estimate) this vehicle as having a cash value of \$25,500.00 USD.
