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ABSTRACT

The abstract should only be typed in a single paragraph and a single-column format and consist of 150-200 words (with Cambria, 10 pt, single line spacing, 1 paragraph, in English). The following points should always be featured: (1) purpose, (2) design/methods/approach, (3) findings, (4) research implications/limitations, and (5) originality/value.

Your submission should include up to 5 appropriate and short keywords that capture the principal topics of the paper

Introduction

Give general definitions and explanations of the subject and include other people's opinions (literature review) to strengthen, contradict, or illustrate your perspective. When required, please highlight disputed and opposing theories. Lastly, we summarize the key findings and briefly discuss the work's primary goal. Please try to make the introduction understandable to scientists who are not in your specific field of study.

Methods

This section describes how the research was designed. The main materials of this section are research design, population and sample, data collection techniques with instrument development, and data analysis techniques. For research using tools and materials, it is necessary to write down the specifications of the tools and materials. The tool specifications describe the sophistication of the tools used, while the material specifications describe the types of materials used. Qualitative research, including case studies, ethnography, phenomenology, grounded research, institution action research, and others, requires the inclusion of researchers, research subjects, informants who assisted with the study, methods for examining research data, the location and duration of the study, and explanations of how to verify the validity of the findings.

Result

The experimental results, their interpretation, and any inferred experimental conclusions should all be clearly and precisely described in this section. Qualitative research can be adapted to the research design.

Discussion

Authors should discuss the results and how they can be interpreted from the perspective of previous studies and the working hypotheses. The findings and their implications should be discussed in the broadest context possible. Future research directions may also be highlighted.

Conclusion

A summary of the primary situation at the time of writing and a discussion of the next steps should be included in the conclusion. Provide a summary and conclusion that restates the main point, highlights important discoveries, and offers suggestions for how your new framework or findings might be used in real-world situations. Describe the implications for future research.

References

References of your manuscript must be up to date (in the last of 5 to 10 years and minimum of 20 references that 30% of the references is from primary sources/journal) and your reference can be accessed by anyone. References should relate only to the material you cited within your article (this is not a bibliography). References should be in APA Style 7th Edition and listed in alphabetical order. Please do not include any abbreviations. Any additional references should be included in an Additional Reading section. Authors are responsible for ensuring that the information in each reference is complete and accurate. All references should be cited within the text; otherwise, these references will be automatically removed. Writing bibliography should use reference manager applications such as Mendeley or Zotero.
