The introduction contains the research background, objectives, and benefits, as well as a literature review. Subheadings are numbered 1, 2, etc. Any theoretical studies can be included in

the introduction as subchapters. Hypotheses can also be briefly included. [Times New Roman 12, Space 1,5].

B. METHOD [Times New Roman 12, Bold]

The research methods section contains the steps used to solve the problem at hand, along with their analysis. The methods section can include a presentation of the problem, analysis, and practical methods used to solve the problem, as well as the implementation of the activities carried out. Subheadings are added using the numbering format 1, 2, etc. [Times New Roman 12, Space 1,5].

C. RESULTS AND DISCUSSIONS [Times New Roman 12, Bold]

The results and discussion section presents the results of the research activities that have been carried out. Research results can be supplemented with tables, graphs (pictures), and/or charts. [Times New Roman12, Space 1,5].

The suggestions section contains the researcher's suggestions for subsequent scientific research that will be carried out with the same and different variables and objects. [Times New Roman 12, Space 1,5].

References contain sources in the form of books, research articles in journals or research reports (including theses, dissertations and dissertations) and are arranged alphabetically, using APA 7th edition. [Times New Roman 12, Space 1].
