Robert E. Lee high school 1965-1968

Larry Molinare began his stellar athletic at Robert E. Lee High School in 1965. Molinare lettered three seasons in football and track and was a varsity winner one year in basketball. Larry proved to be a distinguished student –athlete and was selected by his team to serve as football team captain for the Rebels his senior year. Larry was one of the very first Lee Rebels to receive a Division 1 athletic scholarship, paving the way for many more to come.

Professional career

Upon graduation, Larry received a four-year football scholarship to Texas Tech University where he lettered each year. He was the starting linebacker for three years and was voted team captain of the Red Raiders in 1971. Throughout his Texas Tech football career, Larry received honorable mention All-Southwest Conference, second team All-Southwest Conference, first team All-Southwest Conference, and second team all American honors. In 1971, he was awarded The Best Player of the Year Award by the Lubbock Avalanche Journal, the Pete Cawthon Memorial Award for best all-around football player, and received a nomination for the Kern Tipps Award and played in the 1972 Coaches All-American game. Since his college football years, Larry has served as the President of the Texas Land Title Association, where he was voted Title Man of the Year. Larry also serves as a member of the Texas Title Insurance Guaranty Board and is recognized as a strong leader for a number of Texas Land Title Association committees.
