

Here is an example of a letter FROM A PARENT to a state Attorney General asking them to drop out of the case:

Subject: Stop Attacking Section 504! Drop Out of Texas v. Becerra!

Dear Attorney General,

[Say who you are] I live in **[where you live]**, and my child has a disability. **[Feel free to say what your disability may be]**. I work with professionals providing support to my child.

[Say why you support Section 504 and its rules] I care about Section 504. My child is served equally and fairly because this section supports the added services needed to ensure my child can grow to reach their potential as a productive person. **[feel free to give first hand examples of how your child is supported through section 504.]**

[Say why Texas v. Becerra is bad] I am very upset and angry that you have joined a case in Texas called *Texas v. Becerra* that goes against Section 504 and the updated rules. You are asking the court to get rid of the Section 504 rules and the entire law. In fact, you have added this in as an afterthought, when the heart of the regulations must stay in place to provide necessary support. If the court does what you ask, my child will be severely disadvantaged for reasons far beyond choice. They will not have equal rights – a fundamental principle under our Constitution. This will be true for all the other disabled people in Missouri.

[Say you want them to drop out of the case] I want you to drop out of *Texas v. Becerra*. You should support Section 504 and its rules. You should not be attacking the rights of those with disabilities.

[Ask for a meeting] I want you to meet with me and other people with disabilities. We want to talk to you about the case and why we are so concerned about it.
