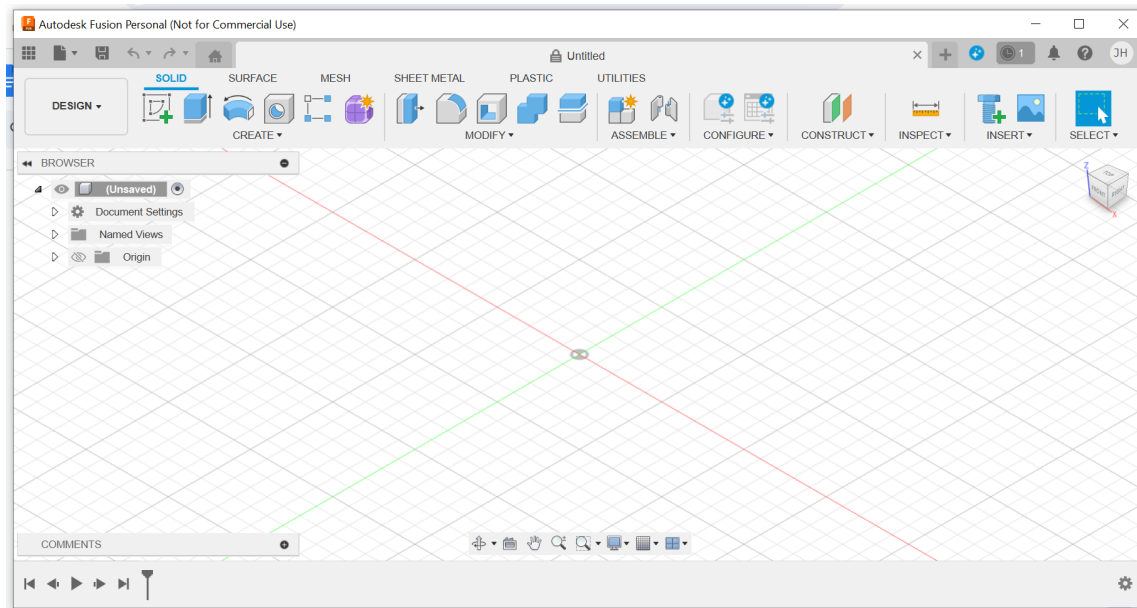


To use this tool you will need to create an account using their 'personal form' - [Personal form](#)

Once downloaded (with administrators permission), you simply log in using your school account. You will also need to make a team:
