Financial Aid Support for Seniors

Financial Aid applications are a requirement for all senior students per California Assembly Bill 469. These applications are important because they help provide financial assistance to students to help cover the cost of tuition, books, living expenses, etc. If your student / child is planning to attend a two year community college, four year university, or trade / vocational school, it is important to apply for financial aid. Many types of scholarships/merit based aid can be offered to students but will require a financial aid application.

There is still time to submit your financial aid applications. If you need assistance completing your application, you can reach out to our Futureology College & Career Counselor for assistance.

Seniors Attending Saddleback College in Fall 2023

Here are a few very important reminders about Saddleback College Application and Financial Aid:

<u>The Promise Program at Saddleback College</u> priority <u>deadline is May 1st</u>! Saddleback College promises to pay the first two years of college for eligible students. Registration fees, support for book costs, health fee, and ASB stamp are included!

- To be eligible for the Promise Program, you must complete the following steps:
 - 1. Complete a Fall 2023 Saddleback College Application.
 - Apply for Financial Aid. This program is **NOT** need based, so your household income does not matter. As long as you do the following by May 1st, you may still qualify for the Promise Program:
 - 3. Complete Matriculation Steps on Mysite.

- All of these steps must be completed in order to be eligible for the Promise Program!

- If you have completed your Saddleback Application but not your financial aid application, you still have time! Even if you do not think you will qualify for financial aid, the Promise Program is not income based! <u>Deadline is May 1st</u> to submit your financial aid application. Complete either the <u>FAFSA</u> or <u>Ca Dream Act</u>.
