

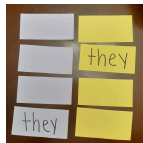
Sight Words Fun

Fun Trick Word Activities to do at home, good for all grade levels. You can use these activities for any of the sight words you have learned in class or your teacher has assigned. **Newer activities are at the bottom.**

Match them!

Write each word on 2 different index cards.

Lay the cards face down and take turns flipping the cards to find the matching words.



HANDS-ON

learning
Use flour, sugar, salt, or shaving cream to write your sight words.



Scavenger Hunt

Write your words on paper (make about 8-10 cards), have an adult tape or place the words throughout the house. Go hunting for sight words!



Rainbow Writing

Write the sight words. Use different colored crayons, markers, or coloring pencils to write your sight words.



Paint

Use your favorite paint colors to paint your sight words (you can use markers if you don't have paint)



Cut and Paste

Use a circular, newspaper, and or old magazine to look for the letters for the words of the week, Cut out the letters then glue them together to spell the words



Snacktime Fun

Use your snack to build your words.



Bean Bag Toss

Write the words on paper, tape them on the wall (or scatter them around the floor), toss the bean bag, and read the word it lands on

***I made a bean bag by putting some beans in a small zip-lock bag and then sealing all around with tape**



Take it outside

Grab some chalk and go outside to practice the words of the week.



You can also stay inside and practice using dry-erase markers



Build Them Use different materials to build your sight words. (Use whatever you have, I used pipe cleaners, Q-tips, and magnetic letters)

Spot a Sight Word



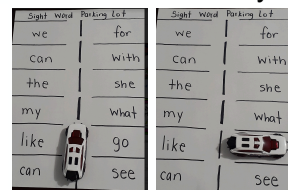
Read your favorite book, see how many of this week's sight words you can find

Write the words in the "spots". "Park" a toy car in the parking space that matches the word someone at home tells you.

Bowling



Write the words on strips of paper, tape or tie the words to bowling pins (or empty water bottles), roll the ball and read the words on the pins that are still standing.

Ball toss

Toss the ball and read the word it lands on



Write the words at the bottom of the cupcake liner. Place it in a cupcake pan then toss a ping pong ball into a cup, read the word it lands on.

Write the words on a piece of paper, set the clock and read one word at a time as fast as you can. Stop the clock when you get to the last word. Do multiple rounds and try to read the words in less time each time.

Roll and Write

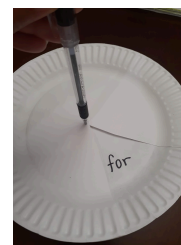
Make a die using cardboard or you can [click here](#) for a printable template.

High Five

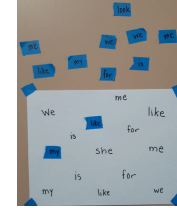
Trace your hands and cut them out, make as many as you need. Write a sight word on each hand. Tape them on the wall. When an adult calls out a sight word, you go and give it a "high five!"

Play Dough Writing

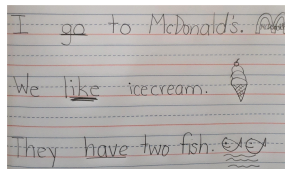
Flatten some play dough and use a stick (such as a toothpick, a skewer, a dowel or a Q-tip without the cotton tips) to write the sight words

Write and Read

Write a sentence for each sight word. Practice reading the sentences. You may record a video and send it to your teacher! **Challenge:** Draw a picture to go with each sentence.



Sight word puzzles



Put two craft sticks together and write your word. Separate and mix up all your pieces. Put the pieces together to make words, read the words.

Challenge:

* Spell the words aloud

WHERE'S THE BEAR?



Write the words on paper cups and hide a small bear or other tiny object. Guess where the bear is hiding by reading the word on the cup.

Challenge:

* Write the words (in a notebook, board, or paper)

SIGHT WORD BOTTLE CAP STAMPERS

Write out the sight words on a sheet of paper and put a splat of paint on a paper plate. Use a cap to stamp the words. Read each word as you stamp it.

Q-Tip painting

Use your favorite paint color and a Q-Tip to practice your words. Write the words on a white piece of paper then use the Q-Tip to trace the words

CRAYON RUBBING

AN ADULT will write the words out with a hot glue gun on rectangles of cardstock. Then have fun rubbing crayons over the cards to reveal the words.

Sight word Hopscotch

Write the words on large colored papers (or white) tape the papers to the floor then have fun hopping from word to word. Make sure to read the words aloud as you hop to it.

Pass the Plates

Write the sight words onto paper plates. Flip the plates face down, play some music or set a timer for a few seconds. Pass the plates back and forth, when the music stops, whoever has the plate flips it over and reads the word.

Write the words on a large piece of paper, leave out the vowels, then write the vowels on post-its. Have fun filling the missing letter.

Write the words on cards and spread them around the floor. An adult calls out the word, the child finds it and stomps on it.



<p>WATER BALLOON TOSS</p>  <p>Write the sight words that you want to practice on the sidewalk with chalk, draw circles around each word to make it a “target”. For extra practice, spell the words together as you write them. Next, fill up your water balloons. Each player takes a water balloon and chooses a sight word they want to aim for.
