



1. SEPTEMBER 8 (FE) Who is Jesus Christ?



• Who did Jesus claim to be?

- o Who do people say that I am? (Matthew 16: 13-30)
- o Joseph's dream (Matthew 1:18-25)
- o Forgiveness of sins reveals Jesus' divinity, that he is the Son of


- God (Mark 2: 1-12).
- o Jesus heals the paralytic (Matthew 9:1-8)
- o Jesus calls a sinner (tax collector) to be an Apostle (Mark 2: 13-17)
- o Jesus dines with sinners (Mark 2: 18-22)
- o Jesus is the "Lord of the Sabbath", Lord of the Law (Mark 2: 23-28).

Christian claim: Jesus is the one Universal Savior, the Son of God:

- o Christ is the I AM (universal Savior):
 - "I AM the light of the world" (John 8:12).
 - "I AM the way, the truth, and the life, and no one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:1-7).
 - "There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name given among men by which we must be saved (Acts 4:5-12).
 - He is true God and true Man. "God from God, Light from Light, true God and from true God, begotten not made, consubstantial with the Father... (Nicene Creed).
- o Miracles: Jesus reveals his divinity:
 - Changes water into wine (John 2:1-12)
 - Jesus' first exorcism (Mark 1: 21-28)
 - Jairus's daughter & woman with hemorrhage (Mark 5: 21-43)
 - Jesus heals the blind man (Mark 8:22-38)
 - Raising Lazarus (John 11).
- o Jesus calls together a Church built on foundation of 12 Apostles:
 - Jesus calls 12 Apostles (Mark 3:13-19)
 - Peter is the "Rock" upon which the Church is built, keeper of the keys to the Kingdom. (Matthew 16:13-19)
 - Catholic Church: the full **Deposit of Faith**. (CCC 84, 1202)



Faith and Reason: God's Existence and Divine Revelation



Plato and Aristotle - The Search for Wisdom

 John Paul II on Faith and Reason: "Faith and Reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth – in a word, to

know himself – so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves."

- o Beauty provokes Delight.
- Delight provokes Wonder.
- **o Wonder** provokes a search for Wisdom (Philosophy).
- o **Philosophy** leads to love of the Source of Good, Truth and Beauty.
- o **Philosophy** (in the classic Greek sense) is the search for the ultimate and highest Truth that stands above and beyond opinion.
- **o** Philosophy opens one up to Faith in God's Word.

• God's Existence can be known through reason alone (CCC 26-49).

- "For from the greatness and beauty of created things comes a corresponding perception of their Creator" (Wisdom 13:5).
- "For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see his invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature. So they have no excuse for not knowing God" (Romans 1:20).
- o Leibnitz (17th century): "Why something and not nothing?"
- o If God exists, it's reasonable to think he would say something.

• Revelation (CCC 50-73).

- o Faith (in general) = belief in a credible testimony.
- o Religious Faith = belief in what God has said, i.e. belief in God's and the Church's testimony. (CCC 1814-1816)



4. SEPTEMBER 29 The Trinity (PF)



- God is Trinity = Community of three co-eternal Persons: Father, Son & Holy Sprit
- Old Testament hints of the Trinity:
 - o Genesis 1:26 (Let us make man in our image, after our likeness)
 - o Genesis 18:1-2 (Three angels of Mamre, Rublev's Icon)
 - o Isaiah 6:1-3 (Holy, Holy, Holy)
 - Psalm 110 (the Lord said to my Lord...from the womb before the Dawn I begot you)
- Christ (New Testament) reveals Trinity (CCC 232-267):
 - o John 1:1-18 (Prologue of John's Gospel)
 - o John 10:30 (The Father and I are one)
 - o John 14:1-11 (Whoever has seen me has seen the Father)
 - o John 14:25-31 (...the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name....)
 - o Matthew 28:16-20
- Trinity is the Creator (CCC 279-301): Everything is created by the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit.
- Nicene Creed (CCC 185-197): Trinitarian structure (said at every Sunday Mass and Holy Day).
 - o I believe in God, the Father Almighty... (CCC 268-278)
 - o I believe in One Lord, Jesus Christ... (CCC 422-686)
 - o I believe in the Holy Spirit... (CCC 687-747)

5. OCTOBER 6 (FE) Creation and the Fall of Creation



- "In the beginning... (Genesis 1:1).... "Big Bang!"
- Angels (CCC 325-336)
 - o Genesis 1:3 (Let there be light...)
 - o Pure spirit
- Matter (CCC 337-354)
 - o Mineral and Vegetable (Genesis 1:1-19)
 - o Animal (Genesis 1:20-15)
- Man & Woman (CCC 355-384)
 - Made in God's "image and likeness" (Genesis 1:26-28)
 - o Matter (Body) + Spirit (Soul) = Man's Original "Solitude", unique in the universe. (Genesis 2:4-9)
- Created Universe = Matter + Man + Angels



The Testing of Angels and Humans, the Fall, and the Scandal of Evil



Original Justice (CCC 374-384)

- o "As long as he remained in the divine intimacy, man would not have to suffer or die. The inner harmony of the human person, the harmony between man and woman, and finally the harmony between the first couple and all creation, comprised the state called "original justice." (CCC 376)
- The Fall and Sin (CCC 385-390)
- The Fall of the Angels (CCC 391-395):
 - o "God saw the light, that is was good; and God divided the light from the darkness." (Genesis 1:4)
 - o "Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which God had made." (Genesis 3:1)

o "How fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! How you are cut down to the ground, you who weakened the nations! For you have said in your heart....I will exalt my throne above the stars of God." (see Isaiah 14:3-23)

Original Sin (CCC 396-412)

- o The sin by which the first humans disobeyed the commandment of God, choosing to follow their own will rather than God's will.
- o From the personal sin of Adam and Eve, original sin is the fallen state of human nature which affects every person born into the world, and from which Christ, the "new Adam," came to redeem us.

• Effects of Original Sin: Fourfold alienation (see CCC 402-409)

- o From self ("I was afraid...I hid myself...", Genesis 3:10).
 - Darkened Mind
 - Weakened Will
 - Disordered Passions
 - Sense of shame, guilt, and loneliness (sadness)
 - Sickness
 - Death

o From one another

- "The man said, 'The woman'..." (Genesis 3:12)
- "Cain rose up against his brother, and killed him" (Genesis 4:8)
- o *From God* ("....whom you gave to be with me, she gave me the fruit of the tree...", Genesis 3:12)
- o *From creation* ("Cursed is the ground because of you...thorns and thistles it will bring forth to you," Genesis 3:17-19)

• Three falls of Man

- o Genesis 3-4 (Adam & Eve, Cain & Abel)
- o Genesis 6 (Nephalim)
- o Genesis 11 (Tower of Babel).

Isaiah the Prophet

- Mary as Seat of Wisdom (CCC 721)
- Marian Holy Days of Obligation:

 - o Assumption (August 15)
- Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary (CCC 971): "All generations will

call me blessed": "The Church's devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship." The Church rightly honors "the Blessed Virgin with special devotion. From the most ancient times the Blessed Virgin has been honored with the title of 'Mother of God,' to whose protection the faithful fly in all their dangers and needs.... This very special devotion ... differs essentially from the adoration which is given to the incarnate Word and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit, and greatly fosters this adoration." The liturgical feasts dedicated to the Mother of God and Marian prayer, such as the rosary, an "epitome of the whole Gospel," express this devotion to the Virgin Mary.

9. NOVEMBER 10 (PF) How to Pray the Rosary



What is the Rosary?

- o It's a form of Meditation:
 - "Meditation engages thought, imagination, emotion, and desire. This mobilization of faculties is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith, prompt the conversion of our heart, and strengthen our will to follow Christ. Christian prayer tries above all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ, as in *lectio divina* (meditating on spiritual reading) or the rosary. This form of prayerful reflection is of great value, but Christian prayer should go further: to the knowledge of the love of the Lord Jesus, to union with him." (CCC 2708)
- o Meditation on what? The key mysteries of the Gospel while reciting Hail Marys.
 - 5 Joyful Mysteries (10 Hail Marys per Mystery):
 - Annunciation
 - Visitation
 - Nativity
 - Presentation in the Temple
 - Finding in the Temple
 - 5 Mysteries of Light (10 Hail Marys per Mystery):
 - Baptism of Christ
 - Changing of Water into Wine at Wedding in Cana
 - Proclamation of the Kingdom

- Transfiguration
- Institution of the Eucharist (at Last Supper)
- 5 Sorrowful Mysteries (10 Hail Marys per Mystery):
 - Agony in the Garden
 - Scourging at the Pillar
 - Crowning with Thorns
 - Carrying of the Cross
 - Crucifixion and Death
- 5 Glorious Mysteries (10 Hail Marys per Mystery):
 - Resurrection
 - Ascension
 - Descent of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost)
 - Assumption of Mary
 - Crowing of Mary as Queen of Heaven & Earth





• What is sin? (CCC 1846-1876)

o An offense against God as well as a fault against reason, truth, and right conscience. Sin is a deliberate thought, word, deed, or omission contrary to the eternal law of God. In judging the gravity of sin, it is customary to distinguish between mortal and venial sins.

 - Say how long since last confession.
 - Name sins. Briefly include any circumstance that would affect the gravity of the sin.

 - Act of Contrition (said by penitent)
 - Absolution (said by priest)
 - Dismissal

o After confession: say or do penance assigned by the priest.
