Leslie High School Dual Enrollment Rules & Expectations

Dual Enrollment is an educational option for high school students whereby the student is officially enrolled in high school and is simultaneously enrolled in one or more college/university classes. By choosing to participate in Dual Enrollment courses, a student is expected to be self-motivated and to meet deadlines set by LHS and the partner college.

Enrollment Eligibility: a student must meet the minimum qualifying test scores on their most recent standardized test and submit an application. Courses require a PSAT/SAT Reading/Writing score of at least 480 and/or Math score of 520.

Eligible Institutions: a state university, community college, or independent non-profit degree granting college or university that is located in this state. Most dual enrollment students at LHS take online courses through Lansing Community College.

Eligible Courses: Course offered by an eligible postsecondary institution for postsecondary credit. Not offered by the eligible student's high school (or is not available to the student due to an unavoidable scheduling conflict). Academic in nature: Normally applies toward satisfaction of postsecondary degree requirements. Not ordinarily taken as an activity course. Not a hobby, craft, or recreational course. In a subject area other than physical education, theology, divinity, or religious education.

LHS Grade & Credit: Dual Enrollment courses will appear on your transcript as Dual Enrollment Course Name (ex. Dual Enrollment – Technical Writing English) and recorded as the grade you receive. In order to earn high school credit, you must pass the college course. If the student passes the course, they will receive 1.5 credits for each semester course. Dual Enrollment courses are weighted in a student's GPA to reflect the rigor of the courses taken.

LHS Schedule: The student's LHS course schedule will allow for 1 class period per college course to work on your Dual Enrollment class in the LHS library. The placement of that hour will be determined by what LHS courses the student requests and the school master schedule. The Dual Enrollment course must fit into the LHS school day but LHS graduation requirements take priority over Dual Enrollment courses.

Cost: All tuition and required course materials will be covered up to the state specified amount. All costs over this allotted amount are the responsibility of the student's family. Required materials include textbooks and lab fees, they do not include parking or transportation. Documentation, such as a receipt and course syllabus, are required for reimbursement of additional course costs. **If you fail or drop this course after the college's window of opportunity, you are required to reimburse Leslie High School the full tuition for the course.** If a student chooses to take Dual Enrollment courses outside of the LHS school day, the student is responsible for all costs.

Commitment: Dual Enrollment at LHS is a full year commitment. Students in the program take 1 Fall Semester course and 1 Spring Semester course, or 2 Fall Semester courses and 2 Spring Semester courses. Students must submit this application by February 28, 2025. If a student is accepted into the LHS Dual Enrollment Program, students must register for Fall Semester courses by April 30, 2025. Students must register for Spring Semester courses by October 31, 2025. Failure to do so will result in removal from the Dual Enrollment Program.
