## 8th Grade BIOGRAPHY WORK 2011

You will have about a month to read the biography and then one week to complete the final project. Keep up with the scheduled response assignments and read the book, using post-its, creating double-entry journals, and the final project will be easier. Requirements:

- Three Double-entry Journals (DEJs) Explained below
- Post-its to mark the influences, obstacles and accomplishments of the subject of your biography.
- Final project: A creative book cover and review.

You need to turn in three (3) weekly double-entry journal responses. DEJ response assignments and due dates:

Each response will have a minimum of five direct passages and an explanation. You may mix the influences, obstacles and accomplishments. Not all biographies are written in the same order as this assignment! The point is to have five of each by the third DEJ. Be sure you do the correct right side response, as they are all different.

Label each type of response either influence, obstacle or accomplishment. (I, O or A)

1.) Week One: For the first one-third 1/3 of your book. Due Tues., Oct. 18

Double entry journal. -- Five passages with responses required

Left side: Direct passages with page numbers that show the early influences in the life of your subject.

Right Side: Write 2-3 sentences that show how important the influence was to your subject.

2.) Week Two: For the second 1/3 of your book. Due Tues., Oct. 25

Double entry journal. Five passages with responses required.

Left Side: Direct passages with page numbers that show the obstacles faced by your subject. Right Side: Write 2-3 sentences that explain what your subject learned from the obstacle.

3.) Week Three: For the final 1/3 of your book. Due Tues., Nov. 1 Double-entry journal. Five passages with responses required.

Left side: Direct passage with page numbers that show the major accomplishments achieved by your subject. Right side: Write 2-3 sentences that explain how the influences and obstacles were a factor in the accomplishments of your subject.

4.) Week Four: Final Project: Due Weds., Nov. 16. Details to be announced.
