## Approved Courses for IS3D Students

### Discipline Description

The major prepares students to develop, implement, and assess public health programs conducted in varied settings with diverse populations, and aims to reduce threats to public health. The major prepares students for entry-level positions in a variety of settings, including government agencies, private/voluntary agencies, hospitals, clinics, and international programs. Students are exposed to the disciplines of epidemiology, environmental health, occupational health, health services administration, and behavioral science.

### Lower Division Courses (choose 6 units)
