

Guidelines for Preparing-Camera Ready Manuscript: Symbiosis Civicus

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ABSTRACT

An abstract must stand alone where the reader must be able to understand the entire contents of the article by reading the abstract. Therefore, the abstract must contain the objectives, methods, essential findings, and conclusions briefly and clearly. Library references, tables, and figures are not permitted in the abstract. The abstract is written in English after the title. Abstract written in one paragraph without the head title of each chapter (goals, methods, results, and conclusions). Avoid using abbreviations in the abstract. However, if it is unavoidable, abbreviations must be defined in the first writing in the abstract as well. The abstract is no more than 250 words, including conjunctions.

1. INTRODUCTION

The introduction section contains an exposition of the issues, challenges, or needs of the community (partners) that underlie or inspire the implementation of community service activities, the objectives of community service activities, and the results of literature review. The entire introduction is integrated into coherent paragraphs. State the purpose of the activity based on a clear and adequate justification of the background analysis towards the partner situation analysis, issues, and solutions. In composing the introduction, also consider readers who may be unfamiliar with the field being written about.

The references cited within the manuscript are written according to the American Psychological Association (APA) 6th Edition style. This section is supported by a literature review that serves to substantiate the concept of community service. Authors are required to present primary literature reviews (references to journal articles and conference proceedings) as well as recent literature reviews (references published within the last 10 years). The literature review is not limited to theory alone but also includes empirical evidence. Enrich this introduction section with efforts previously undertaken by other parties. This article is a result of community service that is an extension of research findings, which can include both the author's own research and that of other researchers.

2. LITERATURE REVIEW

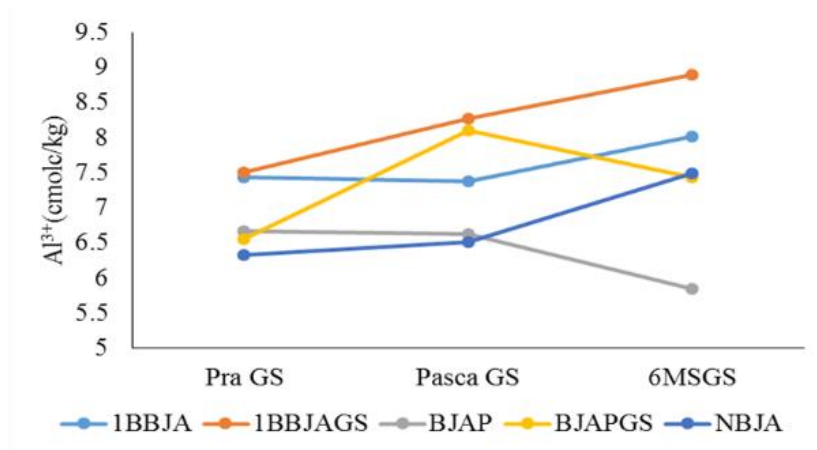
References and citations using the bracket citation technique (author, year). Include the source with the direct quotation along with the specific page number of the quotation. Example: (Davis, 2003). Use the author-date system for writing references, such as '(Kosko, 1999)' or 'according to Kosko's opinion (1999) ...'. Use the author's last name followed by the year of publication. If you want to save energy, it would be better to install the Mendeley application.

3. METHOD

The time and place of implementation are stated at the beginning of the method section. The implementation method section contains a description of the stages or steps in depicting the proposed solutions to address the issues faced by the community (partners).

4. RESULT AND DISCUSSION

The results and discussion section contains an exposition of the outcomes of the community service activities along with the analysis related to the objectives of the activities. Each outcome of the community service must be discussed. The discussion entails interpreting the results and comparing them with relevant theories and/or findings from other research or community service activities. The length of the results and discussion should constitute 40-60% of the total article length. The outcomes of the community service activities can be supplemented with tables, graphs (figures), and/or diagrams.
