Ideas from a parent on potential projects/focus for SAC (D. Bouma)

- 2. Technology in Education: Investing in new tech to enhance learning seems promising, especially tools that make lessons more interactive.

Arts and Cultural Exposure: 4.Bringing local artists into the school or celebrating diverse cultures would enrich our children's educational experience.

- 5. Student-Led Research: Encouraging students to tackle real-world problems can develop their critical thinking and problem-solving skills.
