A meal can be a welcome encouragement for families in transition. You could arrange a pizza meal and connect with the family. Ask how they got where they are, and what their thoughts are about living at a “shelter”. Consider asking how their children are processing it, what they are thinking about their future, and how they can be prayed for. Appreciate them and pray with them.

Help a Neighbor with Yard Work

Agree as a group to extend help to **their neighbors** in need of assistance with work in their yards. Make a goal for each group member to perform the task on the same day, if possible (if not, set the expectation for the same week). Take the opportunity to chat and expand your relationship with your neighbor.

Adopt a School

Choose a school that your group can support through alternative means. Contact the principal at the selected school, identify your group’s desire to be supportive, and ask about current needs that teachers have. Maybe it is a practical need for material items that can be dropped off. Perhaps an encouraging note with a gift card is needed to acknowledge the challenge of teaching during a pandemic.

Appreciate a Postal Carrier

Imagine the surprise on a Postal Carrier’s face that receives a Thank You card (and appreciate the irony). Each member of your group can write a special message of appreciation and give it to (or leave it to be found by) the Postal Carrier. If you have never met your postal carrier, take this opportunity to introduce yourself in this message. Invite a return note from your carrier to ignite a relationship. Want to increase the level of surprise? Consider including a gift card to a restaurant.
