During the second semester of 2023, for AP English Language and Composition, Mr. Gillette tasked his students with creating a documentary about any topic that fascinated them. As for Marilyn Monroe, we talked about how she was practically a slave to the film industry and how her mental illness was well-documented, but no one seemed to care. We compiled all this information into a fun documentary and submitted it.

This shows that I was able to communicate my ideas effectively because I had to find a way to relay this information to an audience in a way that they would understand. Oftentimes, kids today view a lot of issues from a modern standpoint so I had to find a way to present this information in a way that would get their heads to click with how film and Hollywood worked in
