8. Global Nomads Group's Student to World programming
Student to World is a series of free online course modules based on topics of interest to
students. Using video episodes and story-sharing, students will be able to learn global
perspectives on the topics that matter most to them. Student to World is a program

(~1-2hr/week) for Youth (ages 12-19) to explore a global theme through video episodes that include engaging content and global peer story exchange. Video episodes include captioning (in English and Arabic), ASL interpretation and image descriptions. Each module offers up to 6 weeks of content but teachers can participate however their schedule fits. Students learning Arabic can turn Arabic captions on and use corresponding Arabic language vocabulary worksheets to follow along! Once a semester, GNG holds live events with native English and Arabic speakers, giving youth a chance to discuss the process of learning another language, ask questions about culture/daily life in different countries, and share what they've learned in Student to World!
