

Guidelines for Poster and Oral Presentation

A) Poster presentation

Poster size: A0 (size in cm is 84.1 x 118.9 cm). The maximum dimensions allowed for the posters are 120 cm (length) \times 90 cm (width).

Layout/ Orientation: Portrait (vertical).

Author name and corresponding author address:

Author A¹, Author B¹, Author C², Corresponding author³,


Font style and size: Use clear, easy to read fonts. We suggest font size 90 for the title, 60 for the headlines, and 36 for the body text. However, depending on your design suitability you may change it.

Title: Accurately, describe your research project in a concise sentence.

Content:

Your poster should cover six (6) sections:

- Introduction (you may include objective under this section) Provide background information on your study.
- Methodology/Experimental Design Explain your experimental design in a simple way.
- Result and Discussion
 Highlight your major key findings, and interpret them with a short explanation. You may present your data using graphs, figures, and charts. The visual presentation will help people to understand it better.



- Conclusion
 Summarise your findings and provide future perspectives if any.
- References/Bibliography
- Acknowledgment (if any).

You are free to arrange and design according to your preferences and creativity.

There is no limit to the number of figures and tables.

References:

The format for reference/bibliography is not fixed. However, please make sure the format is consistent.

Colour: Preferably, avoid striking colour and use a good colour scheme for your presentation.

Figure: The figure resolution must be 300 dpi to ensure you have excellent printed poster quality.

An example of a poster is available for your reference on the website. Please take note that this is just an example. You are free to design as long as you follow the format.

Attention: Presenters are required to be available at your poster during evaluation.

B) Oral presentation

Presenters are given 10-15 minutes to present. An additional 5 minutes are allocated for question and answer (Q&A). You are encouraged to upload and check your slide before your session starts. Kindly reach out to our secretariat if you face any problems.
