ABSTRAK

ABSTRACT

The abstract must be written in two languages: Indonesian and English, using Times New Roman font size 10 pt, single spacing, and paragraph settings: Before 0 pt, After 0 pt. The length of the abstract should be between 150 to 250 words. Both versions of the abstract are mandatory, including for articles written in English. The Indonesian abstract must be written in formal language according to the standardized rules of Indonesian spelling. The use of citations, abbreviations, and mathematical formulas in the abstract should be avoided. The abstract should concisely present the background, objectives, methods, key results, and conclusions of the research.

1. INTRODUCTION

The introduction must be structured systematically and include the following components: general background, problem formulation or hypothesis (if applicable), and the objective of the article. A review of previous literature (state of the art), which serves as the basis for establishing the novelty of the article, may be integrated within the Introduction or presented in a separate subsection titled *Literature Review*. Authors are given the flexibility to choose the format that best suits their research approach and scientific presentation.

Citations in the manuscript should follow the **APA 7th edition** body-note style, for example: (Akhfas et al., 2021), ((Athallah & Frinaldi, 2025; Elvandari, 2015; Hill, 2020). All cited references must be listed in the reference section and are recommended to be managed using reference management tools such as **Mendeley**.

The Introduction section must be written using **Times New Roman font**, size 12 pt, single spacing (Before: 0 pt, After: 0 pt, Line Spacing: Single), and justified alignment.

2. LITERATURE REVIEW (Optional)

This section presents a discussion of relevant theories, concepts, and previous research

findings related to the topic under study. Authors may choose to present the literature review as a separate section or integrate it into the Introduction. The cited literature must be recent, relevant, and critically analyzed to strengthen the scientific argumentation and support the novelty claim of the article.

This section should be written using **Times New Roman font**, size 12 pt, with single spacing (Before: 0 pt, After: 0 pt, Line Spacing: Single), and justified alignment.

3. RESEARCH METHOD

This section provides a detailed explanation of the research methods used to address the problem, including the analytical approach applied. The description of the methodology must cover all stages of the research systematically and in a manner that allows replication by other researchers.

Only the primary tools and instruments used for analysis or characterization should be listed, including their types, models, and accuracy levels where necessary. Common tools that are generally available in laboratories (such as scissors, measuring cups, or pencils) do not need to be specified in detail.

Authors must clearly state the research location, the number and characteristics of respondents (if applicable), as well as the techniques used for data collection and analysis, whether qualitative or quantitative. Commonly known methods do not need to be explained in depth but should be cited from relevant literature. The research procedure should be written in declarative sentences, not in imperative form.

Any figures presented in this section must include a **figure caption** placed below the image, not embedded within the image itself.

This section must be written using **Times New Roman font, size 12 pt**, with **single spacing** (Before: 0 pt, After: 0 pt, Line Spacing: Single), and **justified alignment**.

4. RESULT AND DISCUSSION

This section presents the research findings and their scientific interpretation in a comprehensive and structured manner. The findings should not merely consist of raw data, but rather data that has been systematically processed and analyzed. The explanation of the results must be logically arranged and based on scientific principles, covering what was discovered, why the findings occurred, and how patterns or trends can be interpreted using scientific approaches.

The discussion must be supported by relevant theories or literature and, where applicable, explained through underlying scientific phenomena. Authors are encouraged to compare their results with previous studies on similar topics to highlight the position and contribution of the article within its field of study. All explanations in this section are expected to address the research questions or hypotheses stated in the Introduction.

Manuscripts may be written in either Indonesian or English, with a maximum length of 20 pages, including tables and figures. The article must follow a camera-ready format using A4 paper size (210 x 297 mm), with margins of 3 cm on all sides. The text should be written in **Times New Roman, font size 12 pt**, with **single spacing** (Before: 0 pt, After: 0 pt), and **justified alignment**. For manuscripts written in Indonesian, foreign terms must be italicized, and the use of equivalent Indonesian terms is recommended whenever available.

Tables and figures must be placed immediately after being referred to in the text, not at the end of the article. Table titles should be written above the table and numbered consecutively (e.g., "Table 1"). Figure captions must be written below the figure and also numbered accordingly. Tables must not contain vertical lines, while horizontal lines should only be used when necessary to clarify the structure of the data. Figures must be of print-quality resolution, with appropriate font size and line thickness to ensure clarity. All

tables, figures, diagrams, or schemes should be placed inline with the text and not on separate pages. Every table and figure must be cited in the body text, for example: "as shown in Figure 1" or "based on the data in Table 2."

$$n = a + b$$

The explanation of the formula should be provided in the following sentence in a descriptive and coherent manner.

Direct quotations must be written in full, enclosed in quotation marks, and accompanied by the source using body-note citation style. For example:

"Scientific knowledge develops through the dialectic between theory and practice" (Rahmawati, 2021, p. 78).

For long quotations (more than 40 words), the quote should be written as a separate indented paragraph without quotation marks.

5. CONCLUSION

The conclusion serves to concisely and clearly summarize the main findings of the study that directly address the research questions, objectives, or hypotheses presented earlier. This section is not intended to restate the entire discussion, but rather to highlight the core scientific contributions obtained from the research process.

Authors are expected to formulate the conclusion in a concise yet comprehensive manner, reflecting the primary contribution of the study. If necessary, the final part of the conclusion may include practical implications, recommendations for scientific development, or suggestions for further research related to the topic or ideas raised in the article.

6. ACKNOWLEDGMENTS (Optional)

This section is intended to express appreciation to parties who have contributed to the implementation of the research, such as financial support from institutions, technical assistance, or other forms of support from individuals or organizations. The acknowledgment is optional and should be placed before the references section.

7. REFERENCES

All sources cited in the body of the manuscript must be fully listed in the reference section. The reference list should primarily consist of **primary sources**, such as scholarly journal articles, with a minimum proportion of **80% of the total references**. Additionally, the cited sources are recommended to be relevant and published within the last **ten (10) years** to ensure the scientific novelty and relevance of the study.

Each manuscript must include at least 10 references. Both in-text citations and the reference list must be consistently formatted using the APA (American Psychological Association) 7th edition referencing style. To facilitate citation and reference management, authors are encouraged to use reference management tools such as Mendeley, Zotero, EndNote, or Reference Manager.
