ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL

Arrival

- For the flow of traffic for Drop-off and Pick-up, please see NHE School Map
- The school gates will open at **8:50** am for all students to enter campus. First Bell rings at 9:05 am. The Late Bell will ring at 9:10 am and all gates will close
- Please DO NOT arrive earlier than 8:45 am. We want to minimize groups waiting outside campus
- Late arrivals after **9:10** am will goto the Front Office to receive a tardy slip. Tardy bell rings at **9:10** am
- Kindergarten-5th grade students need to enter at their designated gates and line up at the painted Room Number. ECSE-UTK should enter campus through their grade level gate. Please review <u>NHE</u> <u>Maps for grade level designated gates</u>
- Older siblings will be permitted to drop off their younger sibling's line up

- Students riding bicycles to school are able to store their bikes by the MPR. Ride into campus on Ward Road
- Teachers will come pick up their class at line up. Families say their goodbyes at line up, we ask that you do not follow your child to their classroom
- Our school parking lots are for Staff Only except for Handicap use
- Please be patient and kind, the morning and afternoon pick-up will be busy. Please allow time for this and drive safely

Classroom Placements

• The staff at Normal Heights Elementary works hard to build equitable, balanced, and diverse classes across a number of factors including gender, race, academics, social-emotional needs as well as other factors. We appreciate your patience and understanding as this is a delicate and ever-changing process as enrollment shifts right up until the start of the school year.

Classes are created based on district class size guidance:

- Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) Hybrid average class size 18:4 ratio
- Grades UTK average of 20-24 students per class
- Grades K-2 have an average of 24 students per class
- Grades 4-5 have an average of 32 students per class

Visitors and Volunteers

- The front office is open daily from 8:30 am-4:00 pm daily. Please remember to wear your mask.
- Volunteers need to fill out a <u>Volunteer Application</u> each year. Contact Cynthia Calderon <u>ccalderon1@sandi.net</u> with your completed form or stop by the front office
- When guidelines permit: We will be allowed one volunteer per classroom per day at this time in accordance with the health and safety guidelines. Please make arrangements with the teacher.

Morning Opening, Assemblies, and Other Gatherings

- Assemblies or public gatherings, will be held either: Hawk Outdoor stage, Blacktop area, or Multi-purpose Room (MPR)
- Daily Morning Announcements are via Public Announcement (PA) System

Student Dress Code

- All students and staff are expected to uphold high standards of conduct and appearance. Normal Heights Elementary encourages a dress code which emphasizes health, safety and comfort.
- Shorts may be worn but they may not be cut up the side jogging style, cut-offs, or extremely short.
- We recommend shoes with rubber soles, ties, velcro, or buckles. Please no flip flops. Dress shoes are not recommended because they are not comfortable at recess or PE.
- Hats and sunglasses are to be worn outside only.

Guidelines for Normal Heights Elementary:

- Shoes must be worn at all times to prevent foot injuries during recess and P.E.
- Clothing should be suitable for normal school activities and considered acceptable attire for children in elementary school (i.e. dresses, slacks, sweaters, blouses, shirts, jeans and mid-thigh walking shorts).

For your child's safety the following items are prohibited:

- Sandals, flip flops, slippers, high heel shoes and shoes with wheels Students must wear tennis shoes on PE day.
- Make-up/lipstick.
- Excess jewelry including dangling earrings that can get caught or snagged.
- Any type of clothing with suggestive words/pictures or advertisements for alcohol, drugs, or tobacco.
- Short shorts, very tight shorts or tight skirts of any kind.
- Strapless or see-through shirts, crop tops, or tops with straps smaller than 1" wide.
- The principal may approve exceptions to the dress code for specific events, such as spirit days and Halloween.

Bicycle Policy

- The San Diego Police Department requests that only students in grades 5 and above ride bicycles to school. Normal Heights has a policy that students in grade 4 and above are allowed to ride their bikes to school. It is highly recommended that younger students ride their bikes to school only with an adult.
- Bike rack is located by the MPR near the Hawks Wings. All students bike onto campus via Ward Road and park/lock their bikes at the bike rack by the MPR. It is highly recommended that bikes be

- locked. SDUSD is not responsible for theft, damage, or loss of use to any bicycle, equipment or article left in/around this area.
- Helmets are required by California law. California state law requires all children ages 17 and under to wear a safety helmet whenever riding a bicycle, scooter, rollerblades, and skateboard.

Bullying and Intimidation Prohibition Policy

- In accordance with district Policy A-3550, bullying or intimidation in any form are prohibited at school or school-related events or outside of school hours with the intention to be carried out during school hours. The district further prohibits the inciting, aiding, coercing or directing of others to commit acts of bullying or intimidation.
- Any staff member who observes, overhears, or otherwise witnesses such actions or to whom such
 actions have been reported must take prompt and appropriate action to stop the behavior and to
 prevent its recurrence as detailed in the applicable administrative procedures. Students,
 parents/guardians, and visitors are also encouraged to report the behaviors to a staff member.

- Except in emergency situations, students will be referred to the principal only after teacher interventions and parent contact have not been successful. The teacher will send a referral slip with appropriate information to the Principal. The student will be counseled and provided guidelines and consequences for future behavior. The parents will be contacted, only if necessary.
- SDUSD has a ZERO TOLERANCE for weapons of any kind and for fighting.

Restorative Discipline Policy (BP 5144)

Positive Behavior & Support

- Our primary goal is for students to be safe at school.
- Students are expected to be responsible and respectful.
- Walk on sidewalks and respect community property. Please do not cut through the Staff Parking lot it is not safe.
- Cross streets at crosswalks only do not drop students off in the street at the drop-off line.
- Leave the school grounds immediately after school unless participating in Afterschool Programs no supervision is provided after school.
- Parents need to set up a designated space to meet their students after school. Students who are not picked up after school will be sent to the office and School Police will be notified.

- Walk quietly while on school grounds please do not run.
- Avoid conflicts with students. Ask an adult for help.

- Keep your hands and feet to yourself.
- Vandalism is considered a serious offense Parents will be required to pay for damages.

- Cell phones may be used before and after school and are to remain off during the day and kept in backpacks - NHE is not responsible for lost or damaged cell phone.s
- Valuable items need to be left at home.

Playground Rules

- Stop playing when the bell rings and wait for instructions. (Freeze, wait for whistle to walk back to line up)

Expected Student Behavior in the Cafeteria & Lunch Arbor

- Lunch will be eaten outside.
- Follow directions.
- Sit at designated spots at the lunch tables and remain seated until dismissed.
- Everyone is responsible for cleaning up your table area including the floor.
- Do not share food.
- Walk to the playground do not run.
- Ask permission to use the restroom or to fill water bottles.

Expected Student Behaviors in the Restroom

- Help keep restrooms clean place paper towels in the trash.
- Do not write on the walls/doors.
- Respect others' privacy.
- No playing in the restrooms.
- Use inside voices.

Parent/Guardian's Responsibility

- Instill in your child a sense of responsibility for what they do.
- Help your child understand the necessity of personal safety.
- Do not park in the drop-off line/cul de sac or bus lane.
- Respect our neighbors do not block driveways or trash/recycling cans.
- Always use crosswalks and sidewalks.
- Do not cut through the Staff Parking lot it is not safe.
- Do not park in the Staff Parking lot the spaces are assigned.

The School Counselor's Role

- The <u>School Counselor</u> is an integral part of supporting students at our school.
- The School Counselor is a student advocate, who listens to problems, counsels students, and assists in resolving conflicts or problem behavior using district approved guidance strategies.

Cell Phone & Smart Devices

- Students are permitted to use cell phones before and after school and powered off and put away in backpacks during school hours.
- Smart devices such as smart watches must be powered off and put away during school hours.
- Normal Heights is not responsible for lost or damaged cell phones/smart devices.
- If a student is found using a cell phone/smart device during school hours, it will be taken away and the parent/guardian will be notified by the teacher to pick it up.

Lost and Found

- Label jackets/sweaters, reusable water bottles, and lunch boxes with your student's name to keep them out of the Lost and Found.
- Students are encouraged to check the Lost and Found cart located in the auditorium frequently for lost items.
- Unclaimed items are donated to Goodwill at Winter Break and Summer Break.

Technology

- Every student UTK-5 will be issued a Chromebook and charger for use at Normal Heights.
- Each student will use the same Chromebook for 3 years before it is refreshed.
- Proper care is critical to the maintenance and longevity of this learning tool.

The Chromebooks are set up for easy direct connection to the school WIFI, access to school programs, and teachers are better able to troubleshoot should a problem arise with the device. The district is not liable for damage or theft of personal computers.
