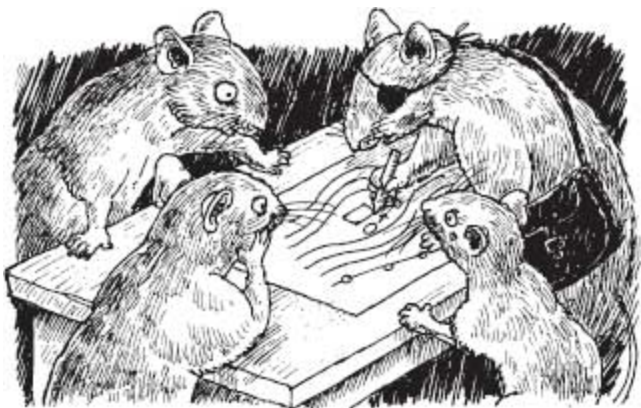


Chapter 13: A Powder for Dragon

word	definition	sentence
furrow (N) /'fʌrəʊ/	a deep line cut into a field that seeds are planted in	the way the furrows made by the plough would curve around it
cover (N) /'kʌvə/	protection from bad weather or an attack	There's just no cover at all. It's wide open
sentry (N) /'sentri/	a soldier who stays in one spot to guard or watch something	We station a sentry to watch him, and we're free to work
