Issue One

A leading crosspartisan political reform group focused on bolstering U.S. elections, improving the digital information environment, enhancing congressional problem-solving, strengthening ethics and accountability, and limiting the influence of big money in politics. Notable achievements include updating the Electoral Count Act, securing federal funding for election cybersecurity, and advocating for a 9/11-style commission to investigate the January 6th attack on the U.S. Capitol1.

Bipartisan Policy Center's Citizens for Political Reform

An initiative of the Bipartisan Policy Center, this group empowers voters to push for positive change and end partisan gridlock. It supports recommendations from the Commission on Political Reform, which includes bipartisan reform suggestions to improve government effectiveness and voter engagement5.

National Association of Nonpartisan Reformers (NANR)

Dedicated to structural election reforms, NANR supports a robust competition among multiple political parties and independents. They advocate for a level playing field, increased electoral competition, and greater voter participation and accountability27.

National Council on Election Integrity (part of Issue One)

Focuses on defending the legitimacy of U.S. elections and democratic processes. This council includes election officials and poll workers advocating for federal funding to strengthen U.S. elections1.

Council for Responsible Social Media (part of Issue One)

Aims to foster a democracy-enhancing information environment, addressing issues related to social media's impact on democratic processes1.

ReFormers Caucus (part of Issue One)

Comprised of nearly 200 former members of Congress, governors, and Cabinet officials, this caucus is united to fix the broken political system through various legislative and advocacy efforts1.

OpenSecrets and the Center for Responsive Politics

While not a traditional non-profit focused solely on reform, OpenSecrets provides critical data and analysis on dark money and campaign finance, which is essential for many reform efforts6.

The Select Committee on the Modernization of Congress (supported by Issue One)

This committee, advocated for by Issue One, has advanced numerous bipartisan recommendations to make the House of Representatives more functional, accessible, transparent, and technologically adept1.

Commission on Political Reform (Bipartisan Policy Center)

Instant Runoff Elections (Ranked Choice Voting)

Citizens Union: Reforming NY City and State govt: IRV, anti-gerrymandering, much more.

FairVote: Researches and advances voting reforms, including ranked choice voting (RCV) or instant runoff voting (IRV). They provide resources and support for jurisdictions implementing RCV.
