The Mayflower Compact

In the name of God Amen. We, whose names are underwritten, the loyal subjects of our **dread sovereign** Lord King James by the grace of God, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland king, defender of the Faith, etc.

Having undertaken, for the glory of God, and advancement of Christian faith and honour of our king and country, a voyage to plant the first colony in the northern parts of Virginia. Do by these presents **solemnly** and **mutually** in the presence of God, and one of another, **covenant** and combine our selves together into a **civil body politic**; for our better ordering, and preservation and furtherance of the ends **aforesaid**; and by virtue hereof to enact, constitute, and frame such just and equal laws, ordinances, acts, constitutions and offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the general good of the Colony: unto which we promise all due submission and obedience. In witness whereof we have hereunder subscribed our names at Cape Cod, the 11 of November, in the year of the reign of our sovereign Lord King James of England, France, and Ireland the eighteenth and of Scotland the fifty-fourth. **Anno Dom**. 1620.
