Do good unto all men (Gal 6:10, Ps 37:3 & Act 10:38 NKJV)

God has created us in Christ Jesus for good works and has blessed us to be fruitful and multiply on earth (Eph 2:10 & Gen 1:28), therefore, whatever is not good should not be seen in us because such is not from God. Doing good is not just about avoiding evil; it entails embracing and pursuing all acts of generosity, kindness, and other behaviors that align with God's will.

Since God is good (Ps 34:8), those who follow Him are called to reflect His goodness through their actions. Performing true good is comprised of two elements: the act of doing something good and the motive underlying the good action you took. In other words, lots of people do good things for the wrong reason. Others truly do what's good for the right reason, and this is what God has called us to do, both for unbelievers and especially those of the household of faith.

As genuine believers, we should be known for our good deeds to all men. The idea of doing good to all men echoes Jesus' words in Matthew 5:16: "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. "Doing good is part of how we make our lights shine, and this is how we portray that we are truly following Jesus's example of doing good wherever we go (Acts 10:38).

Today the Lord would like to show us some ways we can cultivate the habit of doing good to others and especially fellow believers: •

- · Washing the feet of the saints. : This is a true act of humility, leadership, and being of service to each other without looking at status or minding ego (Matt 10:42)
- Don't close your eyes to the needs of other believers and provide and support as the need arises (1st Jhn 3:17 &Rm 15:1-3.
- Supplying or putting in order things that are lacking in the Church or wherever we find ourselves as much as it is in our capacity to do so: Titus 1:5
- Pray for one another and those in authority. 1st Tim 2:2, Eph 6:18.
- Rejoicing and identifying with each other in all things (Rom 12:15-16.+
- Don't criticize (Matt 7:1-5 ,James 4:11-12)
- Don't blaspheme (Matt 12:;31)

Doing good can start today, with little things. Whatever our circumstances, there is always a way to do something good for someone. I pray that the Lord will give us the grace to make doing good common and contagious among us. IJN.

Life matters Topic: DIVINE CHASTISEMENT.

Texts: Hebrews 12:5-11

Action Verse: Prov 3:11-12: My son, do not despise the chastening of the Lord, nor detest His correction, for whom the Lord loves He corrects, just as a father the son in whom he delights

Introduction: : Divine chastisement is the way God disciplines and corrects His people to guide us in the way of righteousness and holiness. It is an expression of love from God to his sons and daughters so He can bring us unto spiritual growth and maturity.

Therefore, the chastisement of God is not essentially for punishment or to inflict pains on His children but to help us be in alignment with His Will and purpose for our lives.

However, it may turn otherwise if we refuse to submit ourselves under the mighty hand of God, for example, king Saul, God was just still warning him that he had acted foolishly for sacrificing as against the Word of God from Samuel the prophet of God, instead to bow down himself and ask for mercy, he decided to be going his own way. 1 Samuel 13

Also, we must note that God only chastises His children, not the world/ unbelievers, and it's for our good so the devil doesn't afflict us in his own wickedness.

Life matter CONd

Purpose of chastisement

For reproof: God uses chastisement to correct, instruct, convict us so he can bring us into his holiness and equip us for our glorious destiny. 2 Timothy 3:16-17.

For redemption: God chastises His children to bring us to glory, buy us back from sin and establishes us in His holiness, thereby instead of the reproach of sin and shame, we enter into His glory. Hebrews 2:10. For example, when David sinned, God chastised him, and after his repentance, He had mercy on him and gave him another child called Solomon who became king in his place.

For Revival of the Spirit: Hebrews 12:10: God uses chastisement to awake us to our responsibility, for example, when Peter was kept in the prison, the church h made prayers for him, Acts 12:1-12, they would have forsaken the way of prayers for when James was taken, they did not pray and they suffered for it from the enemy, so for God to remind them the way of prayers, he permitted Peter to be taken, then they came awake and returned back to their altar of prayers until Peter was released.

For Renewal: John 15:2: God doesn't delay, but He makes some of our requests to tarry sometimes to draw us nearer to Himself, to prune us, to test us and teach us endurance and perseverance which will help strengthen our faith in but not to tempt us
