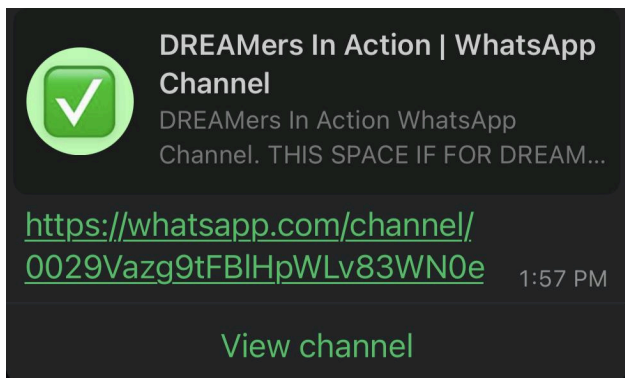

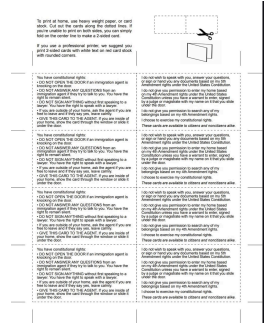

Know your rights cards. Everyone has right regardless of immigration status available in various languages



If an immigration agent tries to question you:


- ✘ **Do not open the door** if an immigration agent is knocking.
- ✘ **Do not answer any questions** from an agent if they try to talk to you. You have the right to remain silent.
- ✘ **Do not sign anything** without first speaking with a lawyer. You have a right to speak with a lawyer.
- ✔ **Do ask the agent** if you are free to leave if you are outside of our home or at work. If they say yes, leave.
- ✔ **Do show them the following slide** through a window, but **do not hand them your phone**.

I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.

I do not wish to speak with you, answer your questions, or sign or hand you any documents based on my 5th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution.

I do not give you permission to enter my home based on my 4th Amendment rights under the United States Constitution unless you have a warrant to enter, signed by a judge or magistrate with my name on it that you give me.

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights.

Administrative Vs. Judicial Warrants

- **Administrative Order:** is an order emitted by the Department of Internal Security. It says that a supervisor permits an agent to arrest certain people. This orden only works in public location. Our home is a PRIVATE space!
- **Judicial Order:** is an order emitted by a judge of a criminal court, which gives authorization to arrest people indicated in the order, in both public and private spaces. **It must be signed by a judge with the correct name and address of the individual in question.**
- ICE usually uses an administrative order

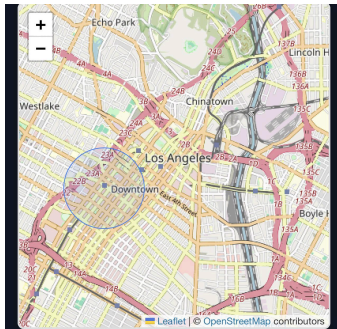

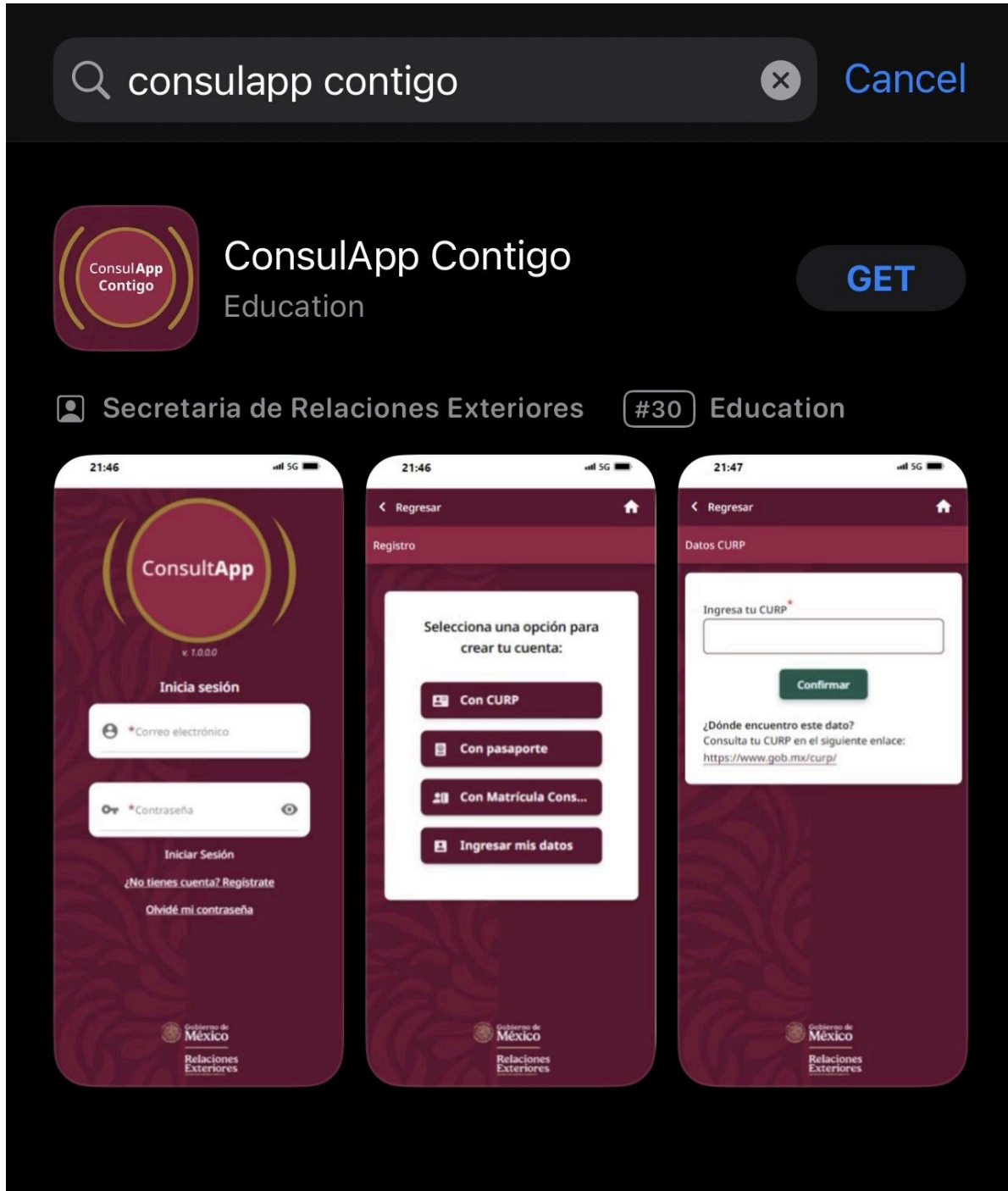

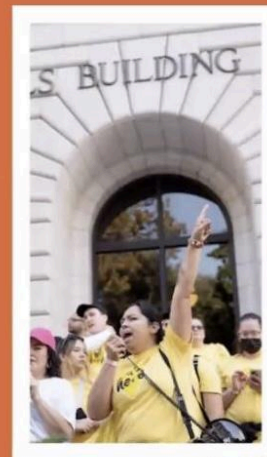
MAKE MEANING OF THIS MOMENT

DACA 5th Circuit Ruling

On January 17th, 2025, the 5th Circuit Court once again ruled against Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) but kept renewals open.

What you need to know:

- DACA RENEWALS ARE STILL OPEN
- DACA RECIPIENTS CONTINUE TO HAVE PROTECTION FROM DEPORTATION NATIONWIDE, INCLUDING IN TEXAS.
- DHS WILL CONTINUE TO ACCEPT FIRST-TIME DACA APPLICATIONS, BUT AS OF NOW, THEY WILL NOT BE PROCESSED.
- IT IS UNCLEAR IF OR WHEN THIS DECISION COULD BE APPEALED IN THE COURTS.



MAKE MEANING OF THIS MOMENT

Breakdown of Trump Actions

National Emergency Declared at the Border

Trump declared a "national emergency" so that he can send military troops to the border.

Trying to Dismantle the 14th Amendment

Trump signed an EO attacking the 14th Amendment which ensures people born in the U.S. have the right to citizenship.

"Remain in Mexico" is Back

Trump has closed the southern border to asylum seekers by limiting who qualifies, shutting down CBPOne, and forcing people to stay in vulnerable conditions.

Mass Deportations & Raids

Trump has empowered DHS by broadening the scope for who is a target for enforcement.

Alien Enemies Act Invoked

Trump wants to weaponize an outdated violent law used to justify Japanese Internment during WWII to detain and deport immigrants.



MAKE MEANING OF THIS MOMENT

Breakdown of Legislative Actions

Today, Congress voted to pass S. 5, The Laken Riley Act with overwhelming support from Democrats in both House and Senate. The bill will now go directly to Trump's desk for signature and will become law nationwide.

S. 5/ H.R. 29 (a.k.a. the Laken Riley Act.)

- This bill would subject immigrants to **indefinite detention without bond** based on mere allegations of petty offenses ending their right to due process.
- This bill also grants state attorney general **overreaching authority to challenge federal immigration law** in the courts.
- **ALL immigrant youth, including underage and/or DACA recipients would be vulnerable to this bill.**



Federal & Local

Knowledge is power. It is important to know which entities perform deportations in order to protect our communities.

- Entities at the federal and local level, while being separate, sometimes collaborate. This is on a county/district basis
- In order to be the most prepared, always ensure to check if your local police department is engaged in ICE collaboration programs such as 287(g).

*287(g)

- A collaboration program between local police and immigration police. This program has authorization from local police to act as an immigration agent.



How we defend ourselves!

If IMMIGRATION AGENTS knock on your door

1. Stay calm
2. Do not open the door
3. Do not answer questions
4. Video tape the situation, if you can
5. Call a family member, an organization, and report/take notes of the interaction.
6. Invite allies to create a circle of protection

How to Record

- Take pictures unless you are on federal property
- Helps depict the reality of raids + helps keep our communities safe.
- It is our right to record

Know Your Power

Record and Report:

Step 1 - Ensure Audio and recording is on and ready to be used and linked to a cloud.

Step 2 - Get information of the officer's, name, badge and agency.

Step 3 - Narrate the date, time and location of event.

Step 4 - Do not disclose the information of your loved ones or yourself to the agents.

Know Your Rights, Know Your Power: Constitutional Rights

With or without status we have rights:

5th Amendment: The right to remain silent and not respond to any questions

4th Amendment: Consent to review your belongings



Know Your Power

Prepare Yourself: If Immigration Agents Come to Your Home

- Fill out your preparedness plan, put it in a folder and label it "**Privilege & Confidential**" and give it to a person you trust.
- **Create a plan in advance** with your family and friends, assigning who will be in charge of your case and who will support at different capacities.
- Make sure your photos and videos are **being synced** to your virtual account like the Cloud or Google photos, in case you record the interaction with ICE so that other people can get it.
- Make sure the fences you have in your **home are closed**. This means that the gating has to be closed with a lock at all the time.
- **Paste a 'Know Your Rights' flyer** and a reminder to record any interaction with ICE inside your door.



Know Your Power

Defend Yourself: If Immigration Agents Come to Your Home

- Keep **calm**.
- **Do not open** the door.
- If immigration agents enter your home without your permission, verbally **express that you do not give them permission** to enter your home or search your belongings. Ask for a search and arrest warrant.
- **Do not answer any questions**, exercise your right to remain silent. If you do choose to answer questions, remember to not lie.
- **Do not sign** any documents.
- Ask to speak with your lawyer or a loved one.
- If you feel safe, **record the event** with your cell phone either through video or audio only.

ICE Lies: Do not agree to what ICE asks, for example, do not follow them to their office, to immigration offices like USCIS or do not agree to meet them for coffee.

1. Reunir todos sus documentos importantes
2. Dejar que un familiar de confianza sepa dónde encontrar los documentos

4. Entregar a la escuela de su hijo una lista de adultos de confianza que puedan recoger a su hijo
5. Consultar con un abogado de inmigración

1. No abra la puerta sin una orden válida firmada por un juez
2. ¡Permanece en silencio! Tienes derecho a no hablar
3. No firme nada sin hablar con un abogado
4. Llame a su abogado o busque ayuda legal al 312.660.1370

¿Qué pasa si ICE viene a su trabajo?

1. Mantenga la calma
2. No proporcione documentos falsos y no los traiga al trabajo
3. No intente interferir con un oficial de ICE
4. Dígalos que quiere hablar con su abogado
5. No firme nada sin hablar con su abogado
6. Mantenga números importantes con usted
7. Si ICE lo detiene mientras estas en el trabajo, asegúrese informarles si tienes niños en las casa



GET PREPARED!



Before an Immigration Raid happens, you should:

1. Gather all your important documents
2. Let a trusted family member know where to find them
3. Talk with your family about what to do if you or someone in the family is detained by ICE
4. Give your child's school a list of trusted adults who can pick up your child if you are detained by ICE
5. Consult with an immigration attorney

What should you do if ICE comes to your Door?

1. Don't open the door without a valid warrant signed by a judge
2. Remain silent! You have the right to not speak
3. Don't sign anything without speaking to an attorney
4. Call your attorney or seek legal help at 312.660.1370

What happens if ICE comes to your Work?

1. Remain calm
2. Don't provide false documents & don't carry them with you
3. Don't attempt to interfere with an ICE officer
4. Tell them you'd like to speak to your attorney
5. Don't sign anything without speaking to an attorney
6. Keep important numbers with you
7. If ICE detains you while at work and you have children at home, make sure you inform ICE

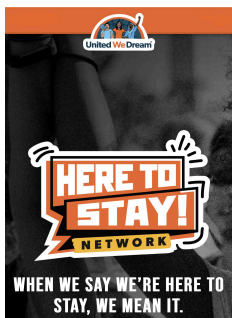
