## State Test Information for Parents and Families

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T.) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year. The purpose of this letter is to give you information on the following assessments:

- See above for your child's testing dates for the PM3 (Progress Monitoring
  3).
- The results from <u>PM3</u> will show how well students have mastered the grade level content standards for the <u>FULL YEAR</u>. You will be provided with information about how to access the results after testing is completed.
- Your child's F.A.S.T. assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get less or more difficult depending on how a student responds, and each student will see different questions. If you or your student would like to review Star Early Literacy, Star Reading, and/or Star Math sample items at home, sample test items are available at <a href="https://flfast.org/resources/renaissance-star/renaissance-star">https://flfast.org/resources/renaissance-star/renaissance-star</a>.
- The <u>Star Early Literacy</u> assessment typically takes less than 15 minutes to complete.
- The Star Reading assessment is usually completed in less than 20 minutes.
- The Star Math assessment typically takes less than 30 minutes to complete.
- Middle school students take a Civics End-of-Course (EOC) Assessment to demonstrate their understanding of civics concepts. This computer-based test covers various topics like government structure, rights, and responsibilities. The EOC accounts for 30% of the overall course grade.
- The 5th Grade Science EOY Assessment assesses science standards taught in 3rd, 4th and 5th grade.

This year, our Moving Up ceremonies were difficult to schedule due to some limitations from the fire marshal in our gymnasium building. They have asked for a sprinkler system to be installed in the gymnasium this summer, and they have asked us to limit the number of people in the building until it is installed, which meant that hosting families would exceed our capacity.

In order to ensure that we have adequate space for families to celebrate the bridging of the Kindergarteners, 3rd graders, and 6th graders, we have rented an event space for these events. Teachers will be telling families more details about their end of year events.

Our Moving Up ceremonies will take place on May 22nd in the beautiful outdoor area of Harmony Haven, 6320 US-98, Bartow, FL 33830. Because this is an outdoor venue, we have a Plan A (No inclement weather) and Plan B (Rainy Day).

All Children's House families are responsible to bring their children to the event and pick them up after the event from the teacher. Families may choose if they are going to bring students back to the school after the event and drop off in a car line, or check them out for the day. If it rains, we will amend the schedule and will split the group into two indoor presentations without treats and photos. We will detail this schedule if it appears that we will have rain. Otherwise, the schedule is:

8:00-8:45- Primary Moving Up Ceremony and Performance

8:45-9:15- Enjoy treats and photos together

**9:15-9:30-** Clean up and reset, parents begin collecting children to either check out or return to school. Kindergarten students may ride the bus back to school.

**9:30-9:45-** Primary Teachers leave and return to school. If they have children dropped off, they do a school day with those students.

#### Third Grade Moving Up

Children in lower elementary (grade 1-3) will have a normal school day and will be dropped off in the carline as usual. Only third-graders will participate in the Moving Up. Students in grade 1 and 2 will remain at the school and will have a movie in the classroom.

**9:45** 3rd graders and teachers board bus to transport to Harmony Haven (HH)

**10:00** Ceremony with 3rd graders performance

10:45 Treats and photos

11:15 Parents leave (may check out student or student may be checked out)

**11:30** Bus leaves with remaining 3rd grade students and teachers to return to school

Information on the upper elementary showcase and middle school programs will be shared by their teachers.

#### • What do I do if I have a concern?

Parents with concerns about their children's educational experience are invited to engage the school through a tiered chain of communication:

- Parents can email the teaching team directly regarding their concern. Some concerns are addressed through a teacher email response. Please note that it may take up to 2 business days to answer an email. Parents may also request a phone call.
- 2. If a satisfactory resolution is not reached, the parent(s) may set an appointment with the student's teacher in order to clarify and ensure that all involved better understand the problem at hand.
- 3. If a satisfactory resolution is not reached through collaboration with the teacher, the parent(s) can make an appointment with the Assistant Principal or his or her designee to address concerns.

- 4. If a satisfactory resolution is not reached through collaboration with the Assistant Principal the parent(s) can make an appointment with the Principal or his or her designee to address concerns.
- 5. If a satisfactory resolution is not reached through collaboration with the administrative team, the parent will communicate in writing to the Family Liaison (who will communicate with the Board). The Family Liaison will meet with the family, mediate the grievance, and document all steps taken to resolve the issue.
