- :P And, then we wouldn't have this problem anymore.
- :P:P:P And your name is, mam.
- :P <Christina> Christina?
- :P <Um-hum> Christina, so how about you, did they tell you you're not artistic?
- :P??? <I don't think anybody told me I wasn't artistic, but I think I noticed myself, that when I drew things they didn't quite look the way they were meant to look, in my opinion> Does the name Picasso rign a bell?

- :P:P:P? So let your eyes come forward and stay in a nice altered state.

enough and you take the time to do it, and you listen, listen, listen. A small amount of listening

produce that amount of music. Imagine what hours and hours, and how much fun it will be to brake one

of the big beliefs you had the gotten away. Because it isn't just about music, and it's not just about

art,

:P it's about changing your life. So that you can do what ever it is that you want. And what ever it

is that you didn't think was possible.

- :P Hey, sit down.
- :P [? take?].
- :P That's right. Really relax now. Go inside your mind and realize you don't have to destroy your

house to be an artist. All you need is a drop clothes and you'll be safe. :P But it does mean that you

can try things, you can try wild modern art, you can also try drawing precise pictures. As you move

back and forth between difference, you always create skill.

:P Because skill. The things that I've done for years has been based on the fact that I tried one

thing and try the opposite.

:P If one thing didn't work, I do something totally different and then find a medium in between, so

that I found ways of doing things, I also use the very old fashion approach. I asked people.

:P When I asked the artist how he drew and he told me about that thing in his head, so that when the

hand on the outside move, his hand moved, it opened up a world of experience for me. [48:40]

- :P And he's just one artist,
- :P there're lots and lots of mental strategies.
- :P This doesn't just go for art and music. I did it with baseball players, who could hit the ball.
- :P ?? I mean, excuse me, but most athletic sports are really profound altered states. Nobody boxes in

the waking state.

- :P You would die,
- :P you have to do pain control, you have to slow time down, race car drivers don't drive in a normal

waking state. They have to go into a profound state where they slow time down, altered states is the

rule, that creates talent, not the exception.

:P When you ask, I saw the spelling show on TV this morning. And they asked this woman how to spell a

very difficult word and she went [гримасничает] and spell the letters.

:P Well, for that moment she was in a miny altered state, which produce the right effect. So that she

could begin to do something that she wanted to do for years.

- :P But all it requires is a little concentration.
- :P [i] A little enthusiasm. And then you can begin to get lost inside of new things. New

opportunities. All kinds of new ways of doing things.

- :P Because this only the beginning.
- :P Of what you can do for the rest of your life. That will open up all kinds of possibilities.
- :P Now I don't think that you should restrict this, because some of you say well I could never learn a

martial art.

- :P I can never learn to swim.
- :P Last time I was in Ireland, four people drawned, they were adults, and they said well, I was

afraid, you know, to swim, and so therefore I never tried. Don't start in the ocean,

: P start in a shallow pool.

- :P Right. And when I have people with swimming phobias, I just give them flippers.
- :P And let them swim around with flippers, anybody can swim with flippers on.
- :P In a nice shallow pool, so that if they have trouble they can stand up. Once they get a little

power I cut an inch off the flippers. And I keep cutting it off until they aggravate them and they take them off.

:P It's not a psychological phenomenon. Yes, the first phobic I had, had falling when they were young child, they were at the beach and they stepped on the sand, and it opened up, and they fell in a big pool, and they almost drowned. Sign[?] then, after that, every time they go near water, their mother would go 'Aaa!'. Like that. Now I don't know if the phobia came from the dramatic experience or from

- the screaming of their mother, but they got to the point where they couldn't wash their hair.
- :P That's overcompensating.
- :P You know. Fortunatelly it was the rastafarian times, so it was OK.
- :P But it still means that rather than making new choices, what you doing is taking expierences and

finding out how to limit it, so that you can avoid something potential bad, rather than to prepare for

it.

- :P Sure sometimes when you paint, you look at it, and go 'this is crap', and you throw it away and start over.
- :P ??? Sometimes you not in the right mood. So you change your mood.
- :P???? Sometimes when I went to play music, it was a last thing on earth I wanted to do, but it was

time to do it.

- :P And that's what it really means to have talent, is that you can alter your state. If Mohamed Ali
- went into a boxing match and he wasn't in a mood that day, he didn't go well I'm sorry,
- :P I just don't feel like it.
- :P He changed his state, he went into a profound state, and that's why he won so much.
- :P He was a very talanted man.
- :P He could see how to... what somebody was doing, he could plan on how things were gonna happen.
- :P [i] And it doesn't mean it's easy. But... Actually the more sophisticated it is, the more you can

enjoy it. And the more you look at something and going 'How the hell that I ever do that?' And try it,

that's what musicians do to learn new things. It's artist do to learn new technics. Nowdays there's

books full of technics for art, and music, and writing, and literature.

:P There you can go online and find thousands of different things. Curvonic[?] it comes right and he

tells how he writes. One of his books.

- :P ??? He writes easily, he pretends he's talking to his sister, telling her a story.
- :P He picks the most bizarre things he could possible think of, and then starts it reality and writes

to it.

:P One of his books begins, he goes, 'I was something like that president of New York, the last

president of the United States.

- :P On the island of death Manhatten,
- :P in the Empire State buliding surronded by Ken Willabras[?]'.
- :P And then he wrote from this reality to that reality.
- :P Well, as this strategy to design something, he came right out one of his books and described it.
- :P It's a different approach. But there're hundreds and hundreds of thousands approaches to music, to

art, to literature. That will produce profoundly interesting results.

day you guys will be able to do that too.

- :P I just master being the most boring date there ever was, women fall asleep the minute I touch them.
- :P Hm-hm. Because in a moment you're going to remember this.

- :P ??? Because when you sit back. Sleep. That's right. You can begin to change the way you approach

things. It doesn't matter it it's pastels or if it's paints. It doesn't matter what it is at all. You

can do amazing things if you let yourself get wild.

- :P But not too wild.
- :P Because you wanna be able to make sure that when it's time to see you really look at things. The

more you really look at things, the more you'll be able to draw and paint them. The more you begin to

listen to things, the more you'll be able to recreate them.

:P It's only through your ability to give yourself a chance and to realize, only thing that stopping

you, is your own belief system.

- :P And if you let your belief system change now
- :P and really feel it inside you, it will stay with you for the rest of your life. So when you open

your eyes, you really gonna see the world this time. In terms of what's possible. Open your eyes now.

- :P Thank you very much. Try a little conciousness, it goes along ways.

- :P Thank you.
- :P <Come. *обнимает*> It's a tough job but somebody's gotta do it. Thank you very much sir.
- :P <...> You bet. Now, this by the way isn't about art. It's not about music. It's about installation.

If you change peoples' beliefs and give them the smallest piece of a new strategy,

- :P then they'll go and do things.
- :P There's still zillions of technics, they could read books about technics, they could take lessons,

and they'll do a lot better. Because they won't be looking at somebody else's disapproval as a guide,

the best guide for what you like is inside you.

- :P It's not about whether I like it, it's about whether you like, it's
- :P a way for your unconscious to communicate with you. Poetry, literature, art, music. This is what

our/art[?] feel/field[?] should produce.

:P It should produce more talented businessmen. It should create people who are solvers of problems,

and those problems become the foundation of whole wealth of experience.

- :P When I ran a physics company, what we did was design new products.
- :P Based on what other people couldn't do.
- :P And I only use the meta-model as a tool to do it. People would come in and go 'Well, this is

impossible'.

:P Or they would come in and say even crazier things. They were trying to figure out how to match

finger prints, and they were trying to do it digitally. In fact, they still do it digitally.

- :P And, guess what they found out.
- :P Terrible's it might sound, fingerprinting isn't as accurate as they wished it was.
- :P Now that we have DNA, we're discovering there's people who had perfect fingerprints matches but the

DNA doesn't match.

- :P I don't know about you guys, I find that a little frightening.
- :P But if we switch technologies and stop taking pictures and turning them into digits, and start

matching pictures to pictures, it's a thing called 'match filters'. Which would really solve this

- :P Or even the same instrument.
- :P If you give up because tobar didn't satisfy you,
- :P excuse me, there's a lot more on the earth than tobars.
- :P In fact, now you hear music where they putting together sitars and classical music and latin[?] drums and...

People are really beginning to combine things, the earth is becoming a small place. But it doesn't mean we should give up our cultures, it means we should find out how well they blend with other things.

- :P And instead of killing each other over religion, we should just make room.
- :P The heavens are infinite, and so should the possibilities be.
- :P The more we create freedom for others, the more we'll have freedom for ourselves.
- :P Every single client, that I breaked the chains of their belief systems, helps me,
- :P because it reenforces my belief that there's more that meets the eye.
- :P And as I like to tell people, just remember,
- :P that.
- :P the candle is a flame, and magic is a foot.
- :P All the time.
- :P Magic is the rule, not the exception.
- :P The fact that people can change guickly...
- :P So Jesus, sometimes people just have a near aircrush and they end up with a phobia of going to the airport for the rest of their life. Why shouldn't it be true that the opposite is true?
- :P And in fact it is. You can get rid of your fears, in an instant.
- :P In fact, you can open up worlds of possibility of reading, and writing, and playing music, and writing poetry.
- :P And doing all kinds of things, designing houses, and clothing. And purses, and shoes. This is a consumer based reality, just think how many people are out there looking get shoes, going 'It just isn't the right shoe'. I've never found the right suitecase, and I have thousands of them.
- :P Seems like everywhere I go I end up getting an extra suitecase to get home.
- :P I could open my own suitecase store when I retire, but I'm gonna look at 'em all and go 'There has to be a better idea'.
- :P Even with my own work I've looked at it and kinda 'naaaaaaah think so!
- :P what do you mean, in two hours to cure a phobia, that's way too long!'. [59:21]
- :P Brief therapy used to be ten sessions and didn't work most of the time.
- :P [t] Now that I've got a down[?], I'm looking for ways to get things done, because humans don't learn slowly, they learn best when they learn quickly. If I drew a stick figures on a deck of cards and well hrrrrr! You'd see the stick figure get up and walk across the room, if I handed you one a week for five years, you'd have no idea what it id.
- :P Because the mind patterns.
- :P The more you pattern things across their mind, the more you talk to people that can do things. And

this isn't just about art and music. I've done this with scizophrenics. Once I can tell the difference between their fantasies and reality, I find people that can for... tell what shared reality is.

- :P You should know what actually happen versus what didn't.
- :P ??? But it doesn't mean that you have to make it the foundation of the future.
- :P The fact that you fell in a hole and got water up your nose doesn't mean that you b... should be afraid to take a bath for the rest of your life. And the fact that some screwed[?] teached said to you 'Woah! You're not musical! Put the tobar down and step away!'
- :P shouldn't become the foundation of your never picking up another instrument and just go nuts to see how much fun you can have. Because you don't have to be Motzart. Motzart did it for living.
- :P You're doing for fun. So the more fun you make it, the more you listen to it, the better you do it, the more time you spend, the more things you try.
- :P Give yourself a chance.
- :P I know I will.
