



United States Homeless Outreach and Mutual Empowerment (HOME) Act

1.1 The usage of all architecture deemed hostile to the public and homeless people by the supreme court will be prohibited on all federal land

1.2 Hostile architecture is hereby banned nationwide in public spaces to prevent discrimination against the homeless, with a multitude of exceptions, including privately owned land, religious organizations and sacred sites as a few examples

1.3 States, under command of their governor, can choose to reject this act and continue usage of hostile architecture, however, until they do so, this bill will be in place nationwide

2.1 An outreach and education program will be set up, giving homeless people education and courses in state owned schools over the summer, including, in some areas, housing, and, mandatory in these education programs, one hot meal a day

3.1 An investigation into the the effectiveness of state owned homeless shelters will commence, and any deemed improper or inadequate will get refurbishments and expansions, many of which will be designed and worked on (for pay) by homeless people in the education program

3.2 The education program will cost 500,000,000\$
