Problem Set:

- 1. Identities have become inextricably intertwined with political party affiliation, leading to political engagement being limited to via political party
- 2. We no longer have a clear national narrative
- 3. We no longer have shared, universal ideas/values that transcend party (e.g. democracy, right to vote, etc.)
- 4. We no longer have a shared sense of national purpose

Response:

- 1. Build Principled Citizens
 - Develop new (non-partisan) positive identities based on a strong sense of purpose and belonging to a new community
 - New identities as principled citizens/peacemakers then enable working with others unlike themselves and working across various fields
 - Build meaningful relationships
 - Result: Freedom from being a partisan actor and gaining a new pathway to act with integrity (w/o needing to compromise our core values) and see others, especially our "opponents", as fully human
- 2. Give Principled Citizens Political Tools/Skills
 - Media literacy/ability to discern what is true
 - Civic engagement skills, from how to register to vote and be a principled voter to interacting w/legislators, writing opinion pieces, GOTV, etc..
 - Focusing on ethical development enables still taking positions/advocacy, but leans into the "how"/process of taking a position as much if not more than the "what"
 - Complementary Approach (TRUST Network):
 - Teach to create processes to enable groups to work through conflict and not get hung up on ideologies
- 3. Mobilize them to engage w/policy at the local + state level
 - Easier to see access points and how they can make a difference at the more local levels
 - People care deeply about their communities and already have pre-existing relationships there
 - Opportunities to learn and practice collaborative transpartisan political work
- 4. Also offer opportunities for national engagement with protecting systems
 - De-emphasizing nat'l work enables avoiding extreme toxicity at this level
 - Helps citizens recognize nested identities and responsibilities...as members of affinity group, local community, state, and national communities

Model Notes:

- 1. Process is pre-figurative, with collaborative decision-making a key tenant
- 2. Intent is to avoid centering efforts around leaders but instead instilling internal power with the women themselves
- 3. Any project has to offer pathways to developing principled citizens--will not pursue if it's a good policy reform, but there are not clear options for meaningful member engagement

Other Observations:

- Beloved Community: Bridges must be built within sub-communities and across sub-communities, which will require tailored tactics to meet unique needs and ways of doing thing
 - Similarly, depending on locality, bridges may also need to be built between orgs as well as between citizens and orgs
 - Where this is already happening, this Working Group should be making this visible to others who want to replicate
