Genius Hour *meets* COVID-19 Project

Hey everyone,

For the 4th 9 weeks, we are doing something fun, inventive, and worthwhile! Of course, we must include an English aspect. The plan is to incorporate your "Genius" idea with some Covid-19 documentation.

Wait, what is **Genius Hour**? Check this out --- LINK.

Directions: Choose an idea below, or create your own, and follow the vague directions with each. Vague directions? Yes, you should decide how creative you get with this. It is YOUR IDEA. Please be sure I can access your documentation (Share it). I need to see that you've written about your idea. You can journal, blog, collage, etc.

Options:

1. Reading Challenge

a. Here is a link to a <u>"Reading Challenge"</u> created by Macaroni Kid. You can follow this one or create your own! Be sure you *document* your readings! Make a connection to our Covid-19 situation.

2. Online Portfolio

- a. It's great having a resume and cover letter; however, what if it were all available online? Wow! Here is an <u>EXAMPLE</u> from a phenomenal student I taught several years ago. She created this online portfolio for her HPT requirement at Monacan. You should create yours with YOUR goals in mind (art, writing, a sport, music, etc.). Be sure you Share it with me! Also, this student used Google Sites!
- 3. Sign Language

a. I'd love to see you next year and be able to see you sign! Wow! I'm thinking of doing this one myself - just a "beginner" status. Here's a helpful <u>SITE</u> that breaks it down by lessons. Document pictures or videos of what you are learning and tell me about it. Connect to Covid-19 - could you explain its impact on your life using sign language?

4. Cooking

a. Choose a cookbook of your choice, and take the challenge to cook <u>every</u> recipe! Document your experience, success/failure, and pictures! How did this help you get through Covid-19? Need some inspiration? <u>There's a movie!</u> Here's a <u>TRAILER</u> to the movie *Julie & Julia*! How fun!

5. Shakespeare

o. Are you reading to tackle some Shakespeare? Awesome! Here is a <u>SHAKESPEARE SITE</u> that is blowing up on the internet! Everyone is loving it! They've even updated their site to help with remote learning! Document what process(es) you are taking to learn and experience the play(s). Can you make any connections to Covid-19? Give it a try.

6. Yoga

a. Why not? If you are missing the gym, try something different! I just found this <u>APP and SITE</u> that gives you 30 days free. Document how it goes. Do you like it? What exercises are your favorite or least fav? Are you inside or out? There are tons of videos online, so find your own, if you want, and share! Or, you can make your own videos!

7. Garden

a. Yes! We all need to get outside, why not borrow or order some packets and get started with your own garden! It could be veggies, herbs, or something more unique! You decide. Document with notes, suggestions, successes/failures, and pictures! Need some help getting started? Here's an <u>ARTICLE</u> created for gardening during Covid!

8. Virtual Volunteer

a. How? Here's one <u>SUGGESTION</u> where you can write letters to those in Hospice. Another idea is to read to students who need 15-20 minutes of reading; this <u>SITE</u> shows you what is needed. You can be a <u>PEN PAL</u> to seniors who are stuck in NY! Of course, you can always Google ways to virtually volunteer or reach out to those you know may be in need. Write about your experience.

9. Ready for Next Year (My JUNIORS)

a. What are your plans for next year? If anything, this situation has made you think about the future. I want you to do some serious legwork (in the mental sense). Research your top three colleges, trade schools, career paths- explain why you chose these three, and find their stats. By this I mean find out what you need for a GPA, ACT/SAT score, deadlines and cost (same goes for requirements for the job you choose). Here comes the kicker-start working on your applications. I know, but this process can be daunting and I want to be here to help. If going to college, find the essays that were required, the application etc, and start working on them. Let me know if you hit any speed bumps. If going to trade school or the military, find someone/a place that answers your questions (create a flowchart of the steps you need to take to wind up where you want to be). What I am looking for: For those going the college route: A Google Slide presentation with information about your top three schools, snapshots of your almost completed

application (if it changes a bit before you actually apply, you have most of the legwork done) and your essays. If you are entering the workforce/military: A Google Slide illustrating the information you have complied about your career choice and your flowchart of steps that need to be accomplished.
