

Right now, it's 7:24 p.m. on October 3, 2023. I *just* got home and turned on the news. A few minutes ago, I was sitting on the bus coming home from the cross country meet when I then heard (55th) Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy, a Republican from California, is no longer the Speaker of the House.

Block 2, 3 & 4 had "Speaker of the House – Kevin McCarthy - Republican"...Well, it's gonna change now! The Speaker of the House is the third most important politician in the land – The President & Vice President taking spots 1 & 2.

Kevin McCarthy is officially the shortest serving Speaker of the House in American history. This is also the first time a Speaker of the House has ever been removed. It is also interesting that the person responsible for requesting McCarthy's removal was a *Republican* themself! Doesn't this sound a bit divisive? Well, this isn't the first time we're seeing such a divide in Washington, DC.

I am going to stick with some more recent political history so you can see that Congress is *often* divided...



2008 – Barack Obama wins the presidency – Congress all Democrat
2012 – Barack Obama wins reelection – House = Republican – Senate = Democrat

2016 – Donald Trump wins the presidency – Congress all Republican
 2020 – Joe Biden wins presidency – House = Republican –

**Senate = Democrat** 

January 2023 – Republican Kevin McCarthy becomes Speaker of the House — Ousted from Speaker of the House on October 3, 2023


In January 2023, it took the House of Representatives 15 attempts to vote for a Speaker of the House (Kevin McCarthy). If there is no Speaker of the House → The House of Representatives cannot do anything...That's it! It was *really* hard for McCarthy to even become Speaker of the House of Representatives. He wasn't a really popular guy. But, the House of Representatives *needed* a Speaker. It took the House of Representatives 15 times to elect McCarthy – The MOST EVERY! Now, it is the first time in American history a Speaker of the House has been *removed* from office... Tuesday's vote to remove Kevin McCarthy as House speaker is a disaster for the GOP and a victory for two groups that are, for different reasons, determined to undermine the Republican Party.

Republican House of Rep. from Florida – Matt Gaetz (pictured) – was the leader of this movement.

Gaetz is seen as an *extreme* conservative. Some people call Gaetz a *MAGA Republican* and that he is in the Trump category when it comes to extreme policy views

Gaetz and Republicans below voted with *all* the **Democrats** to remove McCarthy. This means **every single Democrat** in the House of Representatives voted to remove McCarthy. So, no Democrats voted to help Speaker McCarthy. Why did Republicans vote MCarthy out? Some Republicans voted to remove McCarthy because he was not *conservative* enough, and because he decided to work with President Biden & some Democrats on the recent budget that prevented a government shutdown.

members – on Tuesday were
House Democrats, and that was
obvious to everyone except the
clueless chaos contingent.
Democrats laughed at Mr.
Gaetz on the House floor after
he gave a statement on his
motion to vacate, clearly
grateful to have such a willing
tool in the Florida Republican.

Around 7:45ish, Former Speaker McCarthy walked up to the microphone and gave a press conference. I'm watching it now. I've had to rewind it a few times...Ugh.

McCarthy says that he is worried that the government is becoming more divisive and split than ever. He says that he does not know who will run for the Speaker position. He's said that the Republicans who voted him out don't have a plan for what to do going forward. He's not wrong. As of now, there *are no* plans of who would run. There *are no* plans as to what will happen next.

So...To keep things brief, here's what we have...

The House of Representatives shall chuse their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment.



There is no Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the House of Representatives cannot do any work until they reconvene and elect a *new* Speaker of the House of Representatives...The Republicans are divided amongst themselves as to *who* is their leader. The Republicans disagree about *who* should be the Speaker of the House. But, they do know...Kevin McCarthy *was* the 55th Speaker of the House of Representatives...
