CHOA Annual Meeting, 1/21/2025

- Fire Safety has become a very popular topic:
 - 2017/18 Fires in NoCal and 2025 fires in LA area demonstrate the importance of the topic
 - Non-renewal of homeowner's insurance policies in CA: 1/3 of Orinda policies non-renewed in last 5 years
 - SF Chronicle article on Jan 18: In 2019, Michael Wara, Stanford climate expert identified three populated areas in CA highly susceptible to wildfires: Pacific Palisades, Moraga/Orinda, and Los Altos hills.

 - IBHS (Institute for Business and Home Safety), an insurance-funded research organization, has published a set of recommendations for hardening homes – not adopted widely (yet)

Actions in Moraga/Orinda:

- o 2019? Moraga Fire Code Changes:
 - Stiffened rules: juniper within 10 feet of the street, limb up vegetation within 2
 feet of homes
- o FAC-A (Fire Adapted Community Ambassadors) Program created in 2021:
 - Perform free home assessments to provide recommendations
 - 4 volunteers for Campo: Steve Hoyt, Scott Whipp, Chris Saunders, Greg Wilson
- MOFD creating fuel breaks at the borders of Moraga and Orinda, including work on EBMUD land adjacent to Campo
- Current Grant Program:
 - \$100K obtained by Fire Safe Moraga Orinda, 1/31 deadline to apply
 - Distributes up to \$10K to groups of 5+ homeowners for vegetation removal,
 50/50 cost share, priority for homeowners with physical or financial needs
 - One Campo group is submitting a grant request
- Oct 2024 Tri-Agency Meeting (Orinda & Moraga Town Councils, MOFD Board):
 - MOFD (Chief Winnacker) recommended no flammable materials in Zone 0 (<5 feet): plants, groundcover, fencing, tree branches

- Consistent with insurance industry recommendations
- In Nov, Orinda Mayor requested time to get public feedback
- So far, ~100 comments (70% Orinda/30% Moraga), most are opposed to a change
- Jan 15, 2025 MOFD Board Meeting:
 - Possible Options presented:
 - Immediate adoption
 - Phased Implementation
 - New construction & home sales only
 - No action at all
 - It is unknown what discussion occurred at the meeting

Actions at Campo level:

- Emergency Preparedness Program established in 2019:
 - Led by Steve Hoyt
 - Divided Campo into blocks of 10-20 homes with a Block Captain
 - Develop contact lists, distribute important information
 - Focused mainly on fire safety, but have dealt with earthquake preparedness, too
- Neighborhood Evacuation Plan:
 - Developed by Tom Barni and me in 2021
 - Shows how to exit Campo in an emergency (2/3 on Campo Dr, 1/3 on Via Granada)
 - Posted on front page of CHOA Website, under General Notices

- o Firewise Neighborhood:
 - Program run by NFPA (National Fire Protection Agency)
 - Campo qualifies: renewed every year since 2019
 - Some insurance companies (e.g., AAA, USAA) give small discounts
