- Warehouses/Data Centers
 - Representing Martins Jacoby WA - Judy -Warehouses are now data centers in Upper Mt. Bethel Township and Lower Mt. Bethel Township, Talen Energy in with the developers.
 - Tony-Holland Twp. ordinance regarding data centers, Holland Town ordinance available online 2026-06. Municipalities can use it as a model. Allowed but restrictive, industrial zoned areas only. https://www.hollandtownshipnj.gov/_Content/pdf/ordinances/2154-001.pdf
 - Michelle St. Andre in chat, "Thanks to Tara Mazzone, Knowlton Twp is also being proactive in initiating an ordinance."

- Chris-working on study for Paulins Kill for W&S. Sparta Township headwaters passed a master plan consistency review to eliminate large data centers from being constructed in all the zones.
 - Foodshed [Alliance](#) is the intersection of food farming and the environment, engaging farmers to glean the fields and bring the fresh food to popup markets using volunteers to provide to economically challenged communities. The farming program provides affordable land for lease, education, and help with making a business plan. Environmental protection and monitoring program with residents.
 - Michelle St. Andre in chat, "The gleaning project that Chris Dunbar mentioned is called Local Share and has many opportunities for volunteering. Headed by Christina Parauda she can be reached through the Woodshed Alliance website. LocalShare is a fantastic and extremely successful project."
- Steph-had to close Scudders Falls river access on the weekends again due to picnicking and partying. Working with Army Corps engineers for hardscaping Pt. Pleasant and Fairview river accesses, helping long term soil stability.

 - PFAS in [Washington](#) Township, Warren Co, NJ on the Musconetcong.
 - [Recording](#) of MWA's spring update
 - Sunoco Energy Transfer leak in Washington Crossing, Upper Makefield-[Drilling](#) more/deeper wells to recover jet fuel that seeped into groundwater. Fuel found in another private [well](#).
 - PFAS in [Lambertville](#) (no update)
 - [PFAS](#) found in Wrightstown, Bucks Co., PA wells. Lobby for expanded state [aid](#). (no update)
- Rockfall Rt 29 - Cindy
 - Devil's Tea Table -Inquiry sent from DTT Alliance and LDWS inquiring as to timing. Response: "NJDOT is continuing to work on designs internally and then will be coordinating with state agencies. We hope to reengage with the Design Working Group in the fall."
 - Lambertville/W Amwell
 - I-80 S-Curve and rockfall mitigation pushed back to 2030, pg 27 NJTPA [minutes](#)
- Finkle's/Strand Theater - Cindy Owners back with revised development proposal. "Event space" at Strand, seating up to 150. Demolish portion of historic railroad shed for parking lot. Waiver full site plan review. Refined Hospitality [webpage](#) on the project. Project withdrawn for now as of the beginning of April.

- [Durham Springs](#) in Durham, on Rodges Run, a Landmark Hospitality venue. Updated plan with buildings sliced from 44 to 2, and partially hid the proposed pair of guest cottages (10 bedrooms each) behind a slope on the hillside property off Lehnberg Road. No mention of the sewage plant in the latest plan.
