Resolution 2434 (2038): Resolution regarding Argentinian attempts at Antarctic colonization

Proposed for consideration of the General Assembly at its 2434th meeting.

The General Assembly,

Recalling the Argentinian attempts at Arctic colonization.

Recognizing that the Argentine Federation is de-facto the successor state to Argentina.

Considering that colonization of the antarctic is illegal and violates several UN treaties (especially the Protocol on Environmental Protection to the Antarctic Treaty)

Recognizing that allowing Argentina to do this sets a precedent for more colonization of Antarctica.

Reminds all nations that colonization of Antarctica is a violation of international law.



- 1. <u>Urges</u> all member nations to condemn the Argentine government for their illegal colonization.
- 2. Calls for sanctions to be placed on Argentina if they do not halt their colonization efforts.
- 3. If Argentina does not halt their efforts then the United Nations General Assembly will ask that the Security Council impose sanctions.
- 4. Urges all member states to sign all treaties and agreements related to the Antarctic treaty system
- 5. Calls for Argentine vessels heading towards the area of 64°06'00.0"S 60°54'00.0"W to be halted, inspected and sent back by UN/Antarctic Treaty ships.
- 6. <u>Calls for</u> the international community to remain actively seized
