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Abstract

The abstract contains: (1) Brief background (if any); (2) Research objectives and/or scope; (3) Method used (brief); (4) Summary of results; and (5) Conclusion. The abstract is written in one paragraph in Indonesian using Times New Roman 11pt with 1 space, aligned right and left. The number of words in the **abstract is 150-250 words**. Keywords must be a minimum of 3 words and a maximum of 5 words.

Keywords: keyword 1, keyword 2, keyword 3 (times new roman 11pt).

Introduction

The contents of the introduction reveal (1) the background of the research, (2) related research that has existed, (3) the purpose of the writing. The introduction begins (briefly, for example a maximum of 1 paragraph) with the general background of the study; with the aim of justifying/strengthening the reasons for conducting research.

Before writing down the research objectives, there must be a clear and explicit Gap Analysis or gap statement.

The text "Introduction" and other subheadings use times new roman 11pt bold. The contents of the introduction use normal times new roman 11pt, straight left and right margins with 1.15pt spacing in two columns. The entire article is in paragraph form without numbering or bulleting. Numbering can be changed first, ... second, or (1)..., (2)... in paragraph form. A4 format paper size with normal margins (top, bottom, left, right 1 inch or 2.54 cm).

NB: There is no subtitle "Literature Review", or "Literature Review", or anything else that is theoretical and definitional. Sentences that appear to be general definitions do not need to be written.

If it really requires writing or relating it to a concept/theory, it is best to write it directly in the Discussion (for example by quoting directly).

Method

This section briefly describes the research method. Consists of design, population, sample, data sources, measuring tools/instruments, data collection techniques, and data analysis.

Results

The contents of the research results reveal research findings based on field data obtained using questionnaires, surveys, documents, interviews, observations and other data collection techniques. The results at least contain an element of what/how, whether the data presented has been processed (not raw data), presented in the form of tables or pictures (choose one), or descriptive research and given information that is easy to understand. Write down the findings, but don't discuss the discussion here.

3.1 Table

Tables are written in Times New Roman, font 9, 1 space between tables and paragraphs 1 space. The table consists of a number, table title, table contents, and information below the table (if additional information is needed). There is no space between the information below and the table.

The contents of the table are placed in the middle of a full page (not in two columns) if two columns do not fit on a page

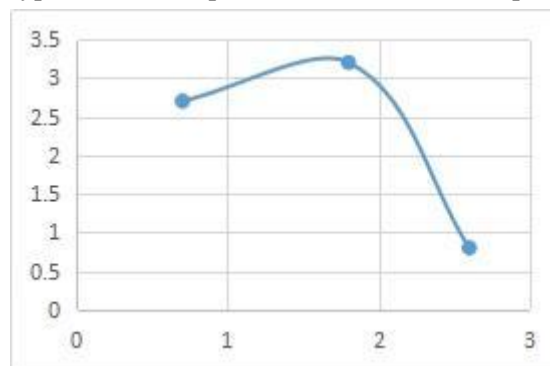

3.2 Graphics/Images

Graphics/images are placed in the middle of a full page (not in two columns) if there are not enough pages in two columns. The graphic title located below consists of the graphic/image number and bold. Times New Roman type, font 10, 1 space. Between tables and paragraphs 1.15 spaces.

Discussion

The contents of the discussion are explained clearly and sharply, reinforced by analysis of the author's arguments based on research findings with theory and previous research results. In the discussion section, it can be seen that there is a connection between the results obtained and the basic concepts and/or hypotheses? The discussions made must be supported by real and clear facts; and Discuss whether there is any conformity or conflict with the results of other people's research.

Conclusion

The conclusion is only enough to answer the problem or research objective, or it can also produce a new theory/concept based on existing facts/analysis; Don't be impressed by discussing more in the Conclusion section. You may add implications or suggestions (not mandatory).

Written in different sentences from the results and discussion sections, contains 400-500 words, no subtitles, numbering or bulleting.

Reference

References are arranged alphabetically based on the last name of the author cited. The reference writing format follows Vancouver as below. Authors are advised to use a reference manager (such as: Mendeley, Zotero, etc.).

Minimum 50% references from the last 10 years and minimum 50 percent from primary literature (scientific journals, proceedings, theses, dissertations). The minimum number of references in the bibliography is 15 references.
