<u>Detective Louis D Razza Watertown Police Benevolent Association</u> <u>Scholarship</u>

This scholarship requires a separate and specific application available in the counseling office. Please be certain that you pick up the correct application for each scholarship for which you are applying.

Qualifications:

- 1. A resident of Watertown/Oakville for at least the past four years.
- 2. Must be an immediate family member of a police officer from any town, OR be pursuing a career in the criminal justice field. (Include information with application)
- 3. Scholastic record/Standardized Testing Scores
- 4. Must be furthering his/her education at an institute of higher learning.

Funds Available:

A check in the amount of \$500.00 will be issued towards the student's educational expenses (i.e. tuition, books, etc.) once the Watertown PBA receives a copy of the bill.

An official awards presentation will be made at the annual Watertown PBA show in November (students need not be present if away at school).

This scholarship is nonrenewable.

Deadline- April 11

Joseph L LeClair Junior & Yvonne LeClair Scholarship

This scholarship requires a separate and specific application available in the counseling office. Please be certain that you pick up the correct application for each scholarship for which you are applying.

Qualifications:

- 1. Must be a Boy Scout who is a resident of Oakville or Watertown, or a member of a Watertown or Oakville Boy Scout Troop.
- 2. Must have been active members of Scouting for a minimum of two years and in good standing.
- 3. Weight for award may be given to Eagle scouts, but is most certainly and should not be limited to any scout rank.
- 4. Awards are weighted more heavily on financial need than on merit, however, both will be considered.

Funds Available:

Number of awards and amount awarded varies from year to year.

Qualifications:

- 1. 12th grade student
- 2. Minimum of a 3.o GPA
- 3. Attending an institution of higher education
- 4. Plan to pursue a career in help children with special leeds and a degree in special education, speech therapy, ABA, occupational therapy, art therapy or music therapy

Funds Available: 2- \$1,000 scholarships

Gertrude Wells Russell- Maria Well Scholarship
