It is our goal at Sumner Middle School to make sure all our students become proficient in math, reading and writing ensuring they are well prepared for high school and beyond. To meet this goal, we provide Math intervention classes and Language Arts intervention classes (15 students or less). In Language arts intervention students learn strategies to improve reading skills along with becoming more fluent, self-assured readers and writers. In Math intervention students learn strategies to improve math skills along with becoming more effective problem-solvers. Your child was placed in one of our Intervention classes to receive extra support based on your child's state assessment data, MAP data, teacher recommendation and/or classroom grades (see next page).

Teachers will use high-quality software-based curricula in intervention classes.
