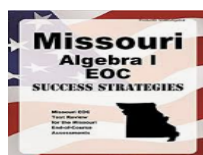

Standardized Testing



The NWEA test will be given 3 times a year to determine student growth throughout the year.



Students will take the Algebra EOC test in the Spring.

How is the assessment portion (80% weighted grade) calculated?

Students will take at least one quiz and one test per unit. These will be divided up by standards so students will have a better understanding of their strengths and weaknesses. Each standard will receive its own score out of 100%

Quiz grade by standard	Test Grade by Same Standard	Gradebook Score
If the quiz score is lower than the test score: EX: 68% *This score will stay in the gradebook until after the test has been graded and recorded.	If the test Score is higher than the quiz score: EX: 90%	The test score would replace the lower quiz score as a student has now practiced with the material and shown growth: EX: 90%
If the quiz score is lower than the test score: EX: 90% *This score will stay in the gradebook until after the test has been graded and recorded.	If the test score is lower than the test score: EX: 68%	The gradebook would have an average of the two values recorded. EX: 79%

*All learning targets will be tested at the conclusion of the unit on the test, even if on the quiz they earned 100%.

*All learning targets on tests can be retaken but will need to be scheduled with the student's teacher in advance for before or after school (in the testing center).
