3. Log in with Google




- 4. Select a Database or use the PowerSearch
- 5. Enter Search terms (use keywords, not entire question)

Ex: Bay Area Homeless v.
San Francisco housing crisis
Are my terms specific? Too limiting?
Boolean search terms: AND, OR, NOT
Ex. Homelessness NOT tiny home

- 6. When you find articles you might use to support background knowledge, highlight passages and add notes. Do this for at least 2 sources
- 7. After you have found ___ articles, click "Highlights & Notes" and then "View all highlights and Notes"
- 8. In the upper right-hand corner, click "Send to:"
- 9. Select Google Drive.
- 10. Click back on your waffle to see that the document is there. On that document, repeat this process with sources from JSTOR, and one citation using Google Citation Generator.


