# GUIDE FOR CONTACTING LEGISLATURE & GOVERNOR'S OFFICE

The \$13.7 million Housing Navigation and Maintenance Program serving former foster youth is preserved in the Legislature's Joint Budget Plan.

Their budget plan also removes the "trigger" the Governor placed on a new foster care rate structure. The new rate structure increases the monthly payment for youth in SILPs to \$2,288. The trigger would make the new rates contingent on available funding in 2026, which means no guarantee. Removing the trigger ensures youth will receive this increased monthly payment.



This is great news! But we're not done yet...



For these investments to make it into the final state budget, we need to encourage both the Assembly and Senate to hold strong in their positions on these investments, and we need to urge the Governor to agree to these positions. The Housing Navigation and Maintenance Program prevents homelessness among former foster youth: It funds supportive services for over 1,300 former foster youth who have a federal Housing Choice Voucher through the Foster Youth to Independence (FYI) or Family Unification Program (FUP). Federal vouchers for former foster youth have been underutilized in California because there was not a source of public funding to provide the required supportive services. Since county child welfare agencies began using the Housing Navigation & Maintenance Program for this purpose, the number of FYI/FUP vouchers for former foster youth has increased 54% in California, bringing \$22.6 million in federal investment to California annually. If this program is eliminated, this effective state/federal partnership will come to a halt and put youth at risk of homelessness.

The proposed foster care rate structure will prevent homelessness among current foster youth: Subjecting California's new foster care rate structure to a trigger means that foster youth have no promise of stable housing. One of many changes this new structure makes is providing a higher monthly payment for older foster youth (nonminor dependents) who are responsible for identifying and paying for their housing themselves. Without this additional assistance for housing, California will continue to see 1 in 5 current foster youth experience homelessness between ages 18-20.

California has a unique responsibility to foster youth, who were removed from their families due to abuse and neglect. When this removal occurred, the State assumed the full legal responsibility to responsibly care for them. Please ensure that California fulfills this responsibility by preserving the Housing Navigation and Maintenance Program and removing the trigger on the foster care rate structure.
