













Kindergarteners will also learn how to count, write, and show numbers 0-5! Students will draw a set of objects to match a given number and will show amounts using different manipulatives (counters or cubes).

Please continue to practice writing the numbers 0 - 5 at home. Students should use real world objects at home (such as toys) to practice counting to tell how many.



In Writing Workshop, Kindergarteners will be sharing their opinions using illustrations and words. Writers will be introduced to the role of an author and illustrator. Students will discuss the features of opinion writing. They will learn to plan and organize an opinion writing piece by supporting their opinions with reasons.

Writers will be introduced to the parts of the sentence e.g. uppercase letter, lowercase letters, punctuation, and spacing between words. Please encourage the students to practice writing their names at home.

Phonics:

Kindergarteners are beginning a new phonics program called Countdown! This program builds strong foundational literacy skills through fun, hands-on, and multi-sensory activities. Module 1 will focus on building the essential skills needed for reading, such as hearing rhyming words, comparing similarities and differences, sorting by categories, and practicing important concepts like before/after, beginning/middle/end, and spatial words such as above/below.

Reading:

Kindergarteners are learning all about stories in reading. We are exploring the ideas of character and setting while enjoying books about families and communities. Through our reading, we will discover how to learn together, share ideas, solve problems, and celebrate differences. We will also explore the big question: What will I discover in Kindergarten?

Science:

The Kindergarten Scientists will be learning about how we can make objects move! Students will explore force and how we can push and pull objects. Students will learn how direction and strength influence the movement of objects.

Social Studies:

Kindergarteners will be learning about the members of our school community and the roles / responsibilities of each person. We are also learning the rules that we must follow to keep everyone safe and happy in school.
