

## Web design/critique

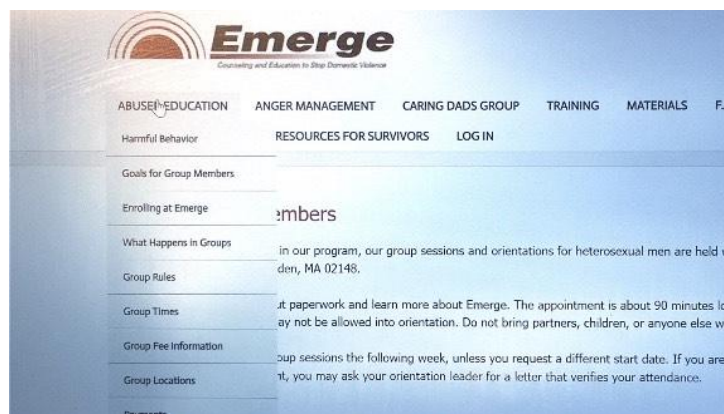
