I. Organizational Purpose and Background

Native Seeds/SEARCH (NS/S) is a non-profit that conserves and promotes the food and farming traditions of the Desert Southwest. The NS/S seed bank stewards a collection of arid-adapted, open-pollinated crop seeds that have cultural roots in over 50 Indigenous and other communities in the U.S. Southwest and Mexico. The AmeriCorps Conservation Garden Associate will play a key role in maintaining and expanding the Tucson seed production gardens to increase the supply of arid-adapted seed for the seed bank, free seed access programs for culturally affiliated communities, and public distribution. This position will be supervised by the Farm Manager and Assistant Farm Manager.

II. Project Focus Areas and Activities

- **A. Community Needs Assessment:** The AmeriCorps member will evaluate the site's programs and services by engaging with stakeholders and conducting assessments, such as a SWOT analysis, to identify strengths and areas for growth. They will compile and present findings with recommendations to site leadership for consideration.
- **B. Skill Building:** The AmeriCorps member will engage in activities that include skill development, hands-on job training, and leadership opportunities that ultimately provide valuable life experience, pathways to higher education, and workforce development.
- **C. Resource Education:** The AmeriCorps member will work with the site's stakeholders and beneficiaries to promote education about available resources.
- **D. Outreach:** The AmeriCorps member will assess current outreach efforts and support the site's plans for community engagement, such as







- developing marketing materials, collecting feedback from community stakeholders and beneficiaries, and working with community partners.
- **E. Evaluation:** The AmeriCorps member will assess the efficacy and efficiency of ongoing programs and services to beneficiaries; assess program impact; and make recommendations for improving programs based on evaluation results.
